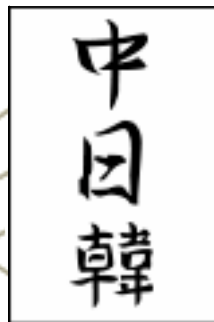


Announcing...

The East Asian Studies Center of Indiana University, with the National Consortium for Teaching about Asia, is engaged in a national multi-year program to improve the teaching of East Asia in America's schools. Hundreds of teachers have taken the seminar and remain committed to incorporating East Asia into their curriculum. Three main elements comprise the program: the 10-week 30-hour seminar, classroom implementation, and a follow up component. This program is generously funded by the Freeman Foundation.
