The IU fees cover tuition, fees and health insurance during the program dates. In order for your family to take advantage of government tax-saver benefit plans, your total program fee is expressed as two separate charges on the Bursar's invoice. Fall and spring fees must be paid by the dates specified on the electronic IUB Bursar's invoice. Any IUB financial aid will be reflected as a credit there. The March 17 prepayment will be applied as a credit to second semester fees.

II. Variable Program Costs

Variable on-site costs are paid abroad as you pay for rent, groceries, meals, personal expenses, and vacation travel. These costs vary significantly from student to student because they are based on your individual spending habits and lifestyle. They are also affected by the exchange rate of the dollar. Use them only as an approximate guide.

To estimate the total cost of study abroad for you, add the resident or nonresident payment to IU to the lower end of the variable cost range if you know how to manage on a smaller budget. Add the IU fee to the higher end of the range if you plan extensive travel and want considerable freedom to purchase clothing and eat out.
