The IU fees include tuition, fees, 2-3 group trips, health insurance during program dates, Colegio housing and some meals in September. In order for your family to take advantage of government tax-saver benefit plans, your total program fee is expressed as two separate charges on the IUB Bursar's invoice.

II. Variable Program Costs

Variable costs are paid abroad as you purchase food and incidentals, pay rent, and travel. These costs vary significantly from student to student because they are based on individual spending habits and lifestyle.
