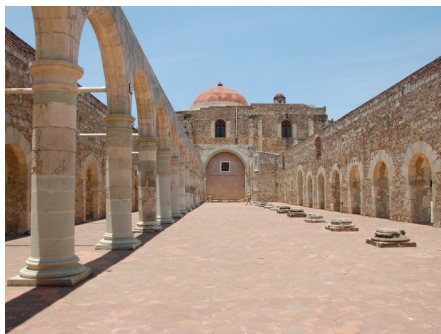

Study Abroad on the Amalfi Coast of Italy this summer! Instruction in English.

This program is designed to introduce students to a broad range of topics, including 1) food, 2) culture change, 3) tourism and 4) cultural persistence. Students will attend lectures on the food, agricultural and fishing practices, the culture of the Italian South, as well as the economic challenges to the coastal communities with globalization and organized crime. The class includes cooking classes; marine ecology; vineyard, orchard, and food explorations; and a guided tour of Pompeii!
