- * 90 credits of combined major, minor and elective course work PLUS 9 credits in approved “T” courses. Not more than 30 credit hours from other approved graduate institutions may be accepted toward the requirements for the PhD. (see 2006 HPER Bulletin p. __) Independent courses such as readings, independent study, thesis, and practicum credit hours completed at another institution OR as part of the master’s program, may not be a part of the doctoral course prescription. (see 2006 HPER Bulletin p. __). All requirements must be completed within six calendar years after the date of initial registration (see 2006 HPER Bulletin p. __)
- ** All Ph.D. students must complete HPER T590 and T591, or their equivalents, as prerequisites to the major work. Credit earned in T590 will not count toward the major or minor, but may be counted toward the total of 90 credits required for the degree. HPER T591 or its equivalent will not count toward the 90 total credit hours and should not be listed on the doctoral course prescription. (see 2006 HPER Bulletin p. __)
- *** These three “T” courses are “typically” completed to fulfill the research and statistics requirement and are in addition to the 90 credits of “course work requirements” (see 2006 HPER Bulletin p. __)
