

Guidelines and Eligibility for Nominations for Intensive Writing Prizes Sponsored by the College of Arts and Sciences and the Campus Writing Program

Eligibility:

- must be currently enrolled at IUB at time of nomination
- must be nominated/ supported by the faculty member who assigned the submitted essay
- must be willing to sign a pledge attesting to the paper's authenticity upon submission
- may be nominated only once per course/section
- may be nominated for more than one prize if nominations are from different courses

Nomination procedure:

All submitted essays must be nominated or supported by the faculty member in whose course the essay was assigned. Faculty nominating students must provide the following:

- an assignment sheet (or its equivalent: a short description of the requirements of the assignment)
- a brief statement (1-5 sentences) describing their aims and expectations for this assignment (e.g. what cognitive skills or theoretical problems they wanted students to practice or confront, what the most difficult part of the assignment was)
- a brief evaluation of how well the student's essay met or exceeded the expectations of the assignment and reader
- certification (included in the nominating letter) that the essay fulfilled the requirements of the assignment
- fall submissions will be reviewed with spring entries for the annual award

Guidelines for submitting nomination form and paper

Papers must be:

- written for a College Intensive Writing course
- the student's individual work; no group reports will be accepted
- submitted to faculty/ instructor for a grade within the semester it was assigned
- at least 6 pages in length (or combination of shorter work totaling at least 6 pages)
- word-processed and submitted in hard copy
- clean and unmarked (no readers' comments or grade, please)
- submitted with student name and university ID number on cover page
- submitted with Application Coversheet and Checklist

To be considered for a 2009-2010 Intensive Writing Essay Prize, applications should be submitted **by 4 pm March 5, 2010** to
