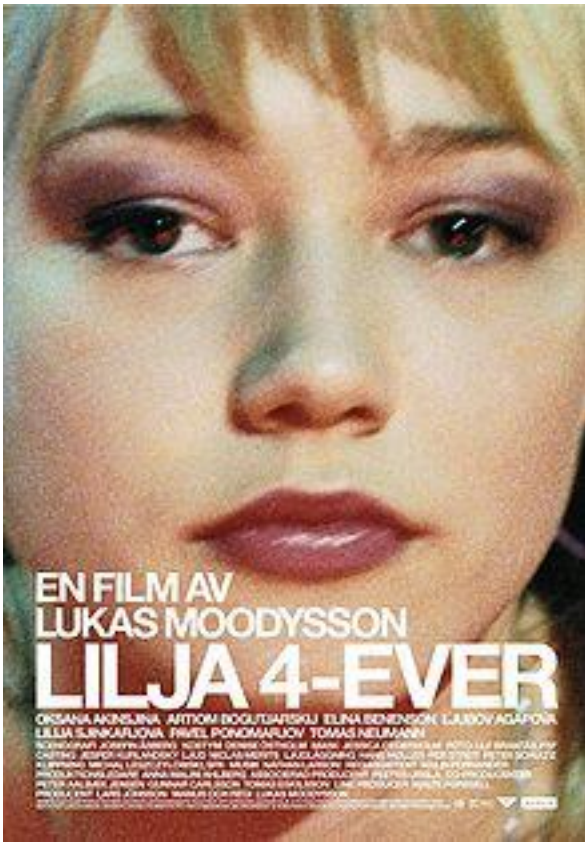

This is the frank and disturbing vision of the life of a young victim of the underground sex trade. The film is a disturbing vision of the despicable actions of that underground life and that wanting a better life is not a crime but that life may shatter the illusion of a happy ending
