



Han Meyer is Professor of Theory and Methods of Urban Design, TU-Delft since 2001. He graduated as an engineer, specialised in urbanism at the TU-Delft Faculty of Architecture in 1979. After his study he worked as an urban planner for the City of Rotterdam and changed to the TU-Delft in 1990. In 1997 he finished his dissertation on transformations of port-cities. He is a member of the Flemish Fund for Scientific Research (FWO), member of the Research Advisory Board of the Netherlands Institute for Spatial Research (RPB), chairman of the board of the International New Town Institute (INTI). He lectured at many universities in Europe, USA and Asia, and is visiting professor at the National University of Singapore. He has published books and articles concerning the transformations of port-cities, the fundamentals of the discipline of urbanism, the development of the Dutch urban block, the Dutch Watercities and the present state-of-the-art of Dutch urbanism.
