The Indiana University Lilly Library presents the Jerry Slocum Puzzle Collection, which embodies a lifetime pursuit of the intriguing, the perplexing, and the compelling. Unlike word or jigsaw puzzles, mechanical puzzles are hand-held objects that must be manipulated to achieve a specific goal. The Rubik's cube and tangrams are popular examples. Confounding and delightful, precise and whimsical, the puzzles in the Slocum collection represent centuries of mathematical, social, and recreational history from across five continents.

Second Annual Homecoming Breakfast

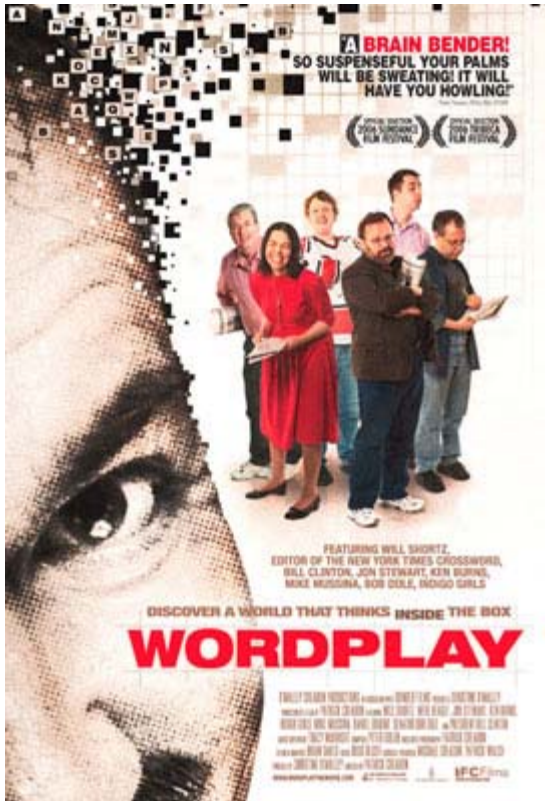

Meet IMP's most distinguished alumnus



Will Shortz, the *New York Times* crossword editor and National Public Radio puzzlemaster, will be coming to IU on Friday, November 2, to be honored at the College's annual recognition banquet as its distinguished alumnus of 2007. Shortz's major in enigmatology, conferred in 1974, was among the earliest individualized majors at IU and remains, according to Shortz, the only one of its kind in the world. Shortz has often attributed his success in part to this unique credential.
