Choose the Appropriate Application

This is the **Freshman Application for Admission**. It is for students who are still in high school, who have not attended college since graduating from high school, or who have fewer than 12 hours of college credit.

Transfer students (those who wish to transfer to IU Bloomington from another college or university) must complete the online **Transfer Application for Admission**. Apply online at www.admit.indiana.edu.

International students (students who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents) must complete either the **International Freshman Application for Admission** or the **International Transfer Application for Admission**. The freshman application is available for completion or download at www.admit.indiana.edu. Call (812) 855-4306 to request a paper copy. International transfer students should apply online at www.admit.indiana.edu.

Application Instructions

Please read these important instructions before completing the application.

Application Fee

We require an application fee of \$50 for U.S. citizens and permanent residents. The application fee is nonrefundable and cannot be applied toward any other bill or fee. Your check or money order should be payable to **Indiana University** and should clearly indicate your name, date of birth, and Social Security number (or IU identification number, if applicable). We cannot accept cash. Payment by check authorizes Indiana University to make a one-time electronic withdrawal from your account in the amount indicated on your check. This transaction will occur within 24 hours of receipt, and no cancelled checks will be returned. Your financial institution will receive a copy of your check for payment if your account cannot be processed electronically. A third party submitting a check on your behalf is considered your agent; you are responsible for providing your agent with these disclosures. For more information on this and other payment options, or if you do not wish to have your check processed electronically, call (812) 855-0661, and select menu number 7.

Official Transcript

If you are attending a U.S. or Canadian high school, have your high school send an official transcript of your grades and graduation date. If you are attending a non-U.S.-style school, submit official copies of your secondary school record. If you are currently enrolled in college-level course work, submit official college transcripts.

Social Security Number (application item 3)

The disclosure of your Social Security number is optional. An alternative IU identification number will be assigned regardless of whether you provide your Social Security number. If you do not wish to disclose your Social Security number, do not provide it on application item 3. However, if you receive any form of federal or state financial aid, or plan to take advantage of educational tax credits/incentives, you are required to use your Social Security number as your IU identification number.

Ethnicity (application item 7)

Ethnic information is confidential and optional. It is used to demonstrate compliance with Title VI of the 1964 Civil Rights Act and Title IX of the 1972 Education Amendments. Nondisclosure will not affect your application in any way.

E-mail (application item 8)

Because we will use e-mail to communicate with you, please give us an e-mail address where we can reach you throughout the year. To update your contact information, log in to www.onestart.indiana.edu, and click on "Self-Service."

Residency (application item 13)

Initial residency classification (for tuition purposes) is determined by the information you provide on the application. In general, U.S. citizens or permanent residents who are 21 years of age are eligible for resident student status after they have been physically present in Indiana for at least 12 months without the predominant purpose of higher education. Students who are under 21 years of age are eligible for resident student status if their parents or legal guardians reside in Indiana. Documentation of legal guardianship is required. Visit registrar.indiana.edu for complete residency information.

Extracurricular Activities (application item 22)

We offer students the option to provide a summary of their important extracurricular involvements during high school. This is not required. If you choose to do so, please attach a separate sheet. You may also submit a personal statement and/or recommendation(s).

Criminal Activity Disclosure (application item 23; required)

We are committed to maintaining a safe learning environment. As such, we require applicants who have been convicted of a felony, or who have engaged in behavior that results in injury to person(s) or personal property, to disclose this information. A previous conviction does not automatically bar admission. If you answer "yes" to item 23, attach a brief explanation describing the incident(s), including the location of the offense(s) or convictions(s), the date(s), your status at the time of release, and the court deposition (in English). In your own words, provide a description of the impact the incident(s) had on you. The explanation must also grant IU complete permission to access your criminal record. Additional information may be requested and additional time required for review.

Scholarships and Financial Aid

Merit-Based Aid. When you apply for admission, we'll automatically consider you for some of IU's merit-based scholarships. For information on additional scholarship opportunities, visit the IU Office of Student Financial Assistance Web site at www.indiana.edu/~sfa.

Need-Based Aid. In order to be considered for need-based financial aid, please submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon after January 1 as possible and before March 1. Because some aid programs are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, an early application receives priority consideration for limited funding sources. FAFSA forms are available at www.fafsa.ed.gov or from your high school. Be sure to list IU's institutional code of **001809** to ensure our Office of Student Financial Assistance receives your information.

Advanced Placement and Military Service Credit

Superior scores on advanced placement/credit tests may be used for placement, course exemption, or the awarding of credit. IU recognizes strong performance on College Board Advanced Placement (AP) examinations, SAT II Subject Tests, SAT or ACT writing components, British-Style advanced-level examinations, International Baccalaureate (IB) higher-level examinations, and placement tests administered by IU. It is also possible to obtain credit for college-level course work already completed. More details are available at www.admit.indiana.edu/freshmen/as_ap.shtml.

Veterans may earn college credit for educational experiences in the armed services. Submit your certified DD Form 295, DD Form 214, and/or transcript from either the Army/American Council on Education Registry Transcript System (AARTS) or the Sailor/Marine American Council on Education Registry Transcript System (SMARTS) with your application. Any additional, relevant military transcripts should also accompany your application.

Application Checklist

- Review Admission Standards.** Review our admission standards and requirements at www.admit.indiana.edu.
- Apply Either Online or on Paper.** We encourage you to submit your application electronically at www.admit.indiana.edu. Our online application is secure and easy to use, and it gives you immediate confirmation that your application has been received.
- Pay Application Fee.** We require a nonrefundable application fee of \$50. If you apply online, you will pay the fee by credit card. If you apply on paper, you must submit a check or money order made payable to Indiana University. Attach the payment to the designated area of the application.
- Get Counselor Signature.** Take your completed and signed application and \$50 fee to your high school counselor well in advance of the appropriate priority date. Ask your counselor to complete the signature section and forward the application to us (we must receive it directly from the school). **If you apply online, you must print the Counselor Signature page and take it to your counselor for completion.**
- Submit High School Transcript.** At many high schools, your counselor will enclose your official high school transcript, the completed admission application and fee, and the Counselor Signature section/page in an envelope and mail the entire packet to us. If this is not possible, please ask your high school to send your official transcript in a separate mailing.
- Submit SAT/ACT Scores.** We require the SAT and/or the ACT, including the writing assessment(s), unless you have been out of high school for more than two years. We will consider the Critical Reading and Math composite score as part of our comprehensive review of applications. Test scores are also used as an aid in academic advising as well as in determining eligibility for the Hutton Honors College, some academic scholarships, and direct freshman admission to some academic departments. Students with competitive writing section scores may be eligible for credit for or exemption from IU English course work. When you register for a test, be sure to ask that your scores be sent to IU Bloomington. Our SAT code is **1324** and our ACT code is **1210**. We will accept a photocopy of your results. (Please attach your results to your application.)
- Check Application Status.** You can go online to check your application status and to see if any of the required credentials are missing from your file. Log in to www.onestart.indiana.edu, and click on "Undergraduate Application Status Check."

Admission Decision. *We practice rolling admissions, and each application is carefully reviewed by our admissions counselors. You can expect to hear from us three to six weeks after we receive your completed application, fee, transcript, and test score(s).*

Application Priority Dates

- November 1** Submit a complete application by this date for priority consideration for many merit-based scholarships
- February 1** Priority date for admission consideration; file the FAFSA before March 1 for priority consideration for need-based aid
- April 1** Applications received after April 1 will be reviewed based on available space
