This is the **International Freshman Application for Admission**. It is for students who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents and who are still in secondary school or who have not attended college since graduating from secondary school.

International students who wish to transfer to IU Bloomington from another college or university must complete the **International Transfer Application for Admission**. It is available for completion online at www.admit.indiana.edu.

Students with U.S. citizenship or U.S. permanent residency must complete either the **Freshman Application for Admission** or the **Transfer Application for Admission**. The freshman application is available for completion or download at www.admit.indiana.edu. Call (812) 855-4306 to request a paper copy. Transfer students must apply online at www.admit.indiana.edu.

English Study at IU. If you are interested in English language study only, IU's Center for English Language Training and the Intensive English Program offer English classes to increase the language skills of nonnative speakers to the level required for study at a college or university in the United States. Application Instructions

Please read these important instructions before completing the application.

Application Fee

We require an application fee of \$60 for international applicants. The application fee is nonrefundable and cannot be applied toward any other bill or fee. Your check or money order should be payable to **Indiana University**, and it should clearly indicate your full name and date of birth. Checks must be drawn on a U.S. bank (or a U.S. branch of a non-U.S. bank) in U.S. dollars. We cannot accept cash, international reply coupons, or euro checks. Payment by check authorizes Indiana University to make a one-time electronic withdrawal from your account in the amount indicated on your check. This transaction will occur within 24 hours of receipt, and no cancelled checks will be returned. Your financial institution will receive a copy of your check for payment if your account cannot be processed electronically. A third party submitting a check on your behalf is considered your agent; you are responsible for providing your agent with these disclosures. For more information on this and other payment options, or if you do not wish to have your check processed electronically, call (812) 855-4306.

Official Transcript or Academic Record

If you are attending a U.S. or Canadian secondary school, have your school send an official transcript of your grades with anticipated or actual date of graduation. If you are attending a British-style school, submit certified copies of your final O-level certificate(s) and copies of your internal records. If you are attending school in Taiwan, submit an official transcript that lists your grades in percentages. If you are attending school in India, submit certified copies of your secondary school certificate mark sheet and your grade XI marks. If you are attending another non-U.S.-style school, submit official copies of your secondary school record. In all cases, 1) the record must be an official copy bearing an original stamp or seal, and 2) if the original record is not in English, be sure to include a certified, literal translation of the entire document.

E-mail (application item 5)

Residency (application item 15)

Initial residency classification (for tuition purposes) is determined by the information you provide on the application. In general, applicants who are 21 years of age are eligible for resident student status after they have been physically present in Indiana for at least 12 months without the predominant purpose of higher education.

Students who are under 21 years of age are eligible for resident student status if their parents or legal guardians reside in Indiana. Documentation of legal guardianship is required. Visit registrar.indiana.edu for complete residency information.

Extracurricular Activities (application item 26)

We offer students the option to provide a summary of their important extracurricular involvements during secondary school. If you choose to do so, please attach a separate sheet. You may also submit a personal statement and/or recommendation(s).

Admission Standards for International Students

To apply for admission, international students must have fulfilled the following requirements. Most admitted students exceed these standards.

Academic Preparation

We require a minimum of 28 semesters of college preparatory curriculum, including:

8 semesters of English or the language of instruction (literature, grammar, composition, journalism)

6 semesters of math (algebra, geometry, advanced algebra)

4 semesters of social science (history, government, economics, psychology, sociology)

2 semesters of natural science (biology, chemistry, physics)

Class Rank

Class rank is considered only if provided by your school. More than 50 percent of admitted freshmen rank in the top 25 percent of their secondary school class. Non-Indiana residents, including international students, generally rank in the upper third.

Standardized Test Scores

IU requires official scores on the SAT I with essay or the ACT with essay. You can submit scores from either test; if you submit more than one set of scores, we'll consider the highest score. Your standardized test results are also used to aid in academic advising and placement and for consideration for modest merit scholarships.

College Preparatory Curriculum

If you will not earn an official U.S. diploma or General Equivalency Diploma (GED), you must complete the college preparatory sequence in the country where you study and live. United Kingdom: Grades of C or higher in at least six O-level exams in liberal arts areas, including math, natural science, social science, English A, and three other subjects. We encourage you to take the A-level exams, and IU generally awards credit for A-levels graded D or higher.

Switzerland: The Federal Maturity Certificate

Advanced Placement/Credit

Superior scores on advanced placement/credit tests may be used for placement, course exemption, or the awarding of credit. IU recognizes strong performance on College Board Advanced Placement (AP) examinations, SAT II Subject Tests, SAT or ACT writing components, British-Style advanced-level examinations, International Baccalaureate (IB) higher-level examinations, and placement tests administered by IU. Professional School: If your future goals include professional school (medicine, law, dentistry, optometry, physical therapy, occupational therapy, etc.), indicate your intended major and professional school interest in item 19.

Application Checklist

- Review Admission Standards.** Review our admission standards on page 1 of this packet, or visit www.admit.indiana.edu.
- Apply Either Online or on Paper.** We encourage you to submit your application electronically at www.admit.indiana.edu. Our online application is secure and easy to use, and it gives you immediate confirmation that your application has been received.
- Pay Application Fee.** We require a nonrefundable application fee of \$60 (U.S. funds). If you apply online, you will pay the fee by credit card. If you apply on paper, you must submit a check or money order made payable to **Indiana University**. Attach the payment to the designated area of the application.
- Get Counselor Signature.** Take your completed and signed application and \$60 fee to your secondary school counselor well in advance of the appropriate priority date. Ask your counselor to complete the signature section and forward the application to us. If you apply online, you must print the Counselor Signature Page and take it to your counselor for completion.
- Submit Official Academic Record(s).** If you are attending a United States or Canadian high school, please have your official transcript sent to us. If you are studying in another country, please submit official copies of your secondary school academic record. If the original is not in English, include a certified literal translation. See page 1 of this packet for complete details.
- Submit Standardized Test Scores.** We require either the SAT or the ACT, with the writing assessment(s), for applicants for fall 2007, unless you have been out of secondary school for more than two years. The results of the writing assessment

are evaluated by the Department of English for possible writing requirement credit or exemption. Test scores are also used to aid in academic advising, placement, and for consideration for some academic scholarships. When you register for a test, be sure to request that your score be sent to IU Bloomington. Our SAT code is **1324**, and our ACT code is **1210**.

- Submit English Proficiency/TOEFL Score.** The Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) is not required for most applicants, although it is required for students applying to the Jacobs School of Music. All new international students must take IU's English Proficiency Examination upon arrival at the university. See below for details.
- Submit Documentation of Financial Support.** Nonimmigrant international students must present proof of financial support to show that sufficient funds are available to cover all study and living expenses for the first year of study at IU. See below for complete details.
- Check Application Status.** You can go online to check the status of your application and to see if any of the required credentials are missing from your file. Log in to www.onestart.indiana.edu, and click on "Undergraduate Application Status Check."

Admission Decision. We practice rolling admissions, and each application is carefully reviewed by our admissions counselors. You can expect to hear from us four to six weeks after we receive your completed application, fee, academic record(s), and test score(s).

Documentation of Financial Support

U.S. immigration regulations require nonimmigrant international students to present proof of financial support for the time they are studying in the United States. Privately sponsored students must submit a letter from the sponsor stating the amount that will be provided as well as confirmation from the sponsor's bank that sufficient funds are available to cover all study and living expenses for the first year of study. Government-sponsored students must submit an official letter from the government specifying the terms of the scholarship. **We cannot issue a formal letter of admission or a visa certificate until we receive this documentation.**

The estimated expenses for 2007–08 (including living expenses during the summer and holiday breaks and the cost of mandatory health insurance) are listed below. Travel expenses to IU and the cost of summer session tuition are not included.

English Proficiency and the TOEFL

TOEFL. The TOEFL is not required for most applicants, although we recommend that scores be submitted by all nonnative speakers of English to assist with academic advising and scholarship consideration. The TOEFL is required for:

- Students who are applying to the Jacobs School of Music, which requires a minimum result of 223 on the computer-based exam or 83 on the Internet-based exam.
- Students who seek admission to IU's Hutton Honors College, which requires a minimum result of 250 on the computer-based exam, 600 on the paper exam, or 100 on the Internet-based exam.
- Students who intend to obtain a second bachelor's degree from the College of Arts and Sciences; the Kelley School of Business; the Jacobs School of Music; or the School of Health, Physical Education, and Recreation.
- Students who wish to be considered for modest merit scholarships.

TOEFL scores should be reported directly to IU Bloomington by the testing service, using IU's TOEFL code of **1324**.

English Proficiency Examination. All new international students must take IU's English Proficiency Examination upon arrival at the university, even if they have also taken the TOEFL. Students will be placed in the appropriate level of English as determined by their scores on the test. Some students will need to enroll in full-time English language courses before beginning regular academic course work.
