Yossi Turner is professor of Modern Jewish Philosophy at the Schechter Institute of Jewish studies in Jerusalem where he founded together with two colleagues the the M.A. program in Contemporary Jewry. He is spending this year at Indiana University as the Visiting Schusterman Professor of Israel Studies. His work in Jewish philosophy focuses on modern Jewish religious thought as well as on the problems facing Jewish existence in the modern and contemporary periods. He is the author of the book *Faith and Humanism: A Study of Franz Rosenzweig's Religious Philosophy* (Hebrew - Hakibutz Hameuchad) as well as numerous articles on modern and contemporary Jewish religious philosophy, philosophies of Jewish existence and Jewish thought on Zion and the Diaspora. He has co-edited *Interaction between Judaism and Christianity in History, Religion, Art, and Literature* (Brill) and *Faith, Truth and Reason: Philosophical Essays on the Legacy of Franz Rosenzweig* (Karl Alber - in print).
