Athletic Training Teacher Education students must apply to, and be accepted into the Athletic Training Program, the Physical Education Teacher Education Program, and the School of Education Teacher Education Program. Requirements for admission to each program are outlined below.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: ATHLETIC TRAINING PROGRAM

Admission to the Athletic Training program is limited. Interested students must apply and be accepted by a screening committee. Career goals, previous athletic training experience and scholastic record are all considered during the screening procedure. Students should make application by April 1 in the spring semester of their freshman year. Notification of acceptance will be made by July 1.

ATHLETIC TRAINING PROGRAM ADMISSION CRITERIA:

- Formal application to the program including:
 - Three letters of recommendation
 - Completion of the athletic training application form
 - Completion of the Technical Standards for Admission form.
- Interview with athletic training admissions committee
- Completion of HPER H160 and P280 with minimum B grade
- Completion of ANAT A215 with minimum C grade
- Achieve a minimum overall GPA of 2.50

(PETE) PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum 2.5 overall GPA in at least 26 credit hours of course work that counts toward graduation. A 2.5 CGPA must be achieved *at the time of application*.
- Successful completion of the following two prerequisite courses with a minimum C grade in each course:
 - Kinesiology P140 Foundation of Physical Education (3 cr.)
 - Kinesiology P141 Fundamentals of Human Movement (2 cr.)
- Submission of an application by the required deadline.
 - November 1 Spring semester
 - March 1 Summer and fall semesters
- Approval for admission by PETE Committee. Admission is currently limited to 30 students per year.
- Three letters of recommendation.

TEACHER EDUCATION ADMISSION (TEP) REQUIREMENTS:

School of Education

- Pass PRAXIS 1 Test: (PPST)
Paper and computer-based (Math 175, Reading 176, Writing 172)
- Complete the following education courses

- Obtain a GPA of 2.5 of higher (major, professional education, and overall)
