

Budapest CIEE courses and IU Equivalencies

15 credits are required for the Budapest CIEE program

Select courses as follows:

- I. Required Hungarian Language course (3 credits)
- II. Select 12 additional credits by choosing one of the following:
 - a. Select CIEE area studies courses
 - b. Enroll in up to two Business and/or Economics courses at Corvinus University (these do not count towards the BUS major or minor)
 - c. Complete an internship in place of one course

*NOTE: undistributed 100-level (-OS 100) courses have not yet been evaluated by a department on campus, so they do not have an IU course number. You may present the course description/syllabus to the appropriate departments so they can assign an IU course number before you go abroad. Some departments may require you to present the course materials for their review after you complete the program. You may leave the course as -OS 100 and count the hours as elective credit toward graduation, or in some cases these courses may be used to fulfill distribution (AH, SH) requirements. This **tentative** list includes fall AND spring semester courses and is subject to change.*
