All students are required to take one Arabic language course (3 credits, based on placement) and 12 additional credits in courses that are taught in English. There is also an optional "Survival Arabic" course available prior to the orientation program and is strongly recommended. If you are placed in one of the accelerated Arabic courses at AUC, you will most likely obtain 6 credits instead of 3.

Note: Undistributed Overseas Study courses (DEPT-OS 100) have not yet been evaluated by an IU department, so they do not have a specific IU equivalent yet. You must have to present a course description, syllabus, and other materials to the appropriate department to have the course approved. In some cases the course may count as elective credit only. DEPT-OS 2/3/400 courses have been evaluated by the department as being equivalent to 2/3/400 level coursework, but there is no specific IU equivalent based on content.
