

Dublin IES Course Equivalency List

Students are required to take 15 credits on the Dublin IES program.

You must enroll in a minimum of 15 credits on the Dublin IES program. You may substitute one of your IES area studies courses with:

a. an outside course at the European Business School (ESB); or

Courses are offered in two tracks: International Business or Sales & Management. Courses are only available to Business majors and minors, although students with coursework in relevant majors (such as Economics) may be considered. **Kelley School of Business does not grant major credit for classes taken at the European Business School.** Economics courses carry prerequisites in micro- and macro-economics.
