

Hebrew University Course Requirements and Equivalency List

This list is subject to change

Required course load each semester

**All students are required to enroll in a minimum of 15 credits per semester.

- **Ulpan (Intensive Hebrew)**
 - Course is taken before the regular semester begins
 - Credit awarded will depend on what level you place into
 - Fall or academic year* students will receive **6** credits
 - Spring students will receive **3** credits

**Note: academic year students do not have to repeat Ulpan during spring term. Instead, they will be required to enroll in an additional 3-credit course to maintain a 15-credit minimum per term.*

- **1 required Hebrew language course**
 - Credit awarded will depend on a Hebrew placement exam
 - Class usually carries **3** or **4** credits
- **1 required Jewish or Israeli Studies course (3 credits)**
- **Two or three additional courses (6-9 credits)**

Course equivalencies

On the next page begins a list of some of the courses students have taken in Jerusalem the past few years. They do not represent ALL courses available at the Rothberg International School/Hebrew University. You are encouraged to select courses based on their content and by comparing/contrasting that content to the courses still required of you at IU rather than only picking courses on this list. Although you will be required to complete an advising process before you leave, you will not be able to determine the final schedule until you arrive in Jerusalem.

Undistributed Overseas Study courses (**DEPT-OS 100**) have not yet been evaluated by an IU department, so they do not have a specific IU equivalent yet. You may present the course description and syllabus to the appropriate department to have the course pre-approved for a specific IU equivalent before you go abroad. Please note that some departments may require that you present course materials after you complete the course before they will grant a course equivalency. In some cases the course may count as elective credit only. DEPT-OS 2/3/400

courses have been evaluated by the department as being equivalent to 2/3/400 level coursework, but there is no specific IU equivalent based on content.
