The total fixed fee includes tuition, housing, some meals, bus transportation between the airport and student housing, field trips, course materials and health insurance valid during the program. In late April you will be notified by the Bloomington Bursar via e-mail that your statement is available for viewing and printing from the web through OneStart.

In order for your family to take advantage of government tax-saver benefit plans, your total program fee will be expressed as two separate charges on the Bursar's invoice. The fees listed as "IU-admin" are the instructional fees that qualify as educational costs.

II. Variable program costs

Variable costs are paid in Amsterdam as you pay for additional meals, personal expenses, books and weekend travel. These costs can vary significantly from student to student depending on your lifestyle and travel plans.

IU Withdrawal and Refund Policy

Students that withdraw from IU administered programs are responsible for non-recoverable costs. Your Bursar account will be assessed an additional charge to cover any/all amounts that Overseas Study has committed or paid on your behalf and are non-recoverable at the time of withdrawal, possibly including housing, meals, transportation, and faculty or staff compensation.
