The IU fees cover tuition, fees, health insurance, and one month of housing during the program dates. In order for your family to take advantage of government tax-saver benefit plans, your total program fee is expressed as two separate charges on the Bursar's invoice.

II. Variable Program Costs

Variable on-site costs are paid abroad as you pay for rent, groceries, meals, personal expenses, and vacation travel. These costs vary significantly from student to student because they are based on your individual spending habits and lifestyle.
