The total fixed fee includes tuition, housing, most meals, local transportation, group excursions, entrance fees on excursions, and health insurance valid during program dates. In late April you will be notified by the Bloomington Bursar via e-mail that your statement is available for viewing and printing from the web through OneStart. Your prepayment and any IUB financial aid will be reflected as credits there. Stafford loans will be disbursed in two payments. Please contact the Office of Financial Assistance with any questions concerning loan disbursement.

In order for your family to take advantage of government tax-saver benefit plans, your total program fee will be expressed as two separate charges on the Bursar's invoice. The fees listed as "IU-admin" are the instructional fees that qualify as educational costs. Those listed as "Miscellaneous" include all the non-instructional costs of the program, such as housing, meals and health insurance.

II. Variable program costs

Variable costs are paid in Graz as you pay for snacks, personal expenses, and weekend travel. These costs can vary significantly from student to student depending on your lifestyle and travel plans. The cost is also affected by the changing value of the dollar. Use the cost ranges below as a guide for your budget.
