



I. Estimated Tuition Fees Paid to Hebrew University*

Total to Hebrew University \$13,705

Checks should be payable to “The Hebrew University of Jerusalem”, One Battery Park Plaza, 25th Floor, New York, NY 10004. Fee includes summer Ulpan and full year tuition, health insurance and cell phone rental.

In late April, July and November you will be notified by the Bloomington bursar via e-mail that your statement is available for viewing and printing from the web through their QuickPay application, any applicable IUB financial aid will be reflected as credits there.

If your **financial assistance** is greater than the combined IU fees, the difference will be refunded to you. Bloomington campus students should arrange to have the refund deposited directly into their U.S. checking accounts, see the Bursar website for directions. If for some reason direct deposit is not an option, instruct the Bursar to mail a check to your permanent address where someone is authorized to open your mail and deposit the check into your bank account. *It is your responsibility to send your payment to Hebrew University. IU will not send payments to Hebrew University on behalf of the students.*

The **Overseas Study Fee** (co-spons) that you are charged is an unremittable portion of IU tuition, which cannot be waived if you are to receive IU credit. It is used to retire IU's construction bonds and is not retained by Overseas Study.

*** Based on the 2008-09 rate, actual fee may be slightly different depending on the 2009-10 fees set by the Indiana University Board of Trustees this summer.*

The **IU Service fee** underwrites the activities of the Office of Overseas Study.

III. Other Program Costs

In addition to the fees paid to IU and Hebrew University, it is estimated you will need \$6,095 for housing, about \$500 for course materials and textbooks, and \$6,000 for meals and personal expenses. These sums are estimates and may vary from one student to another depending on your lifestyle and budget.

IU Refund Policy

Once paid, the \$200 IU Service Fee is non-refundable. The Overseas Study Fee is refunded on a cost-recoverable basis only.
