The Overseas Study fee includes tuition and medical insurance valid anywhere outside the U.S. during the dates of the program. In late July you will be notified by the Bloomington Bursar via e-mail that your statement is available for viewing and printing from the web through their QuickPay application. The \$500 prepayment and any applicable IUB financial aid will be reflected as credits there.

In order for your family to take advantage of government tax-saver benefit plans, your total program fee will be expressed as two separate charges on the Bursar's invoice. The fees listed as "OVST fees (IU-admin program)" are the academic fees that qualify for tax-saver benefits. Those listed as "OVST Miscellaneous charges" include all the non-academic costs of the program, such as health insurance.

II. Variable Program Costs

In addition to the fee you pay IU, you will need funds in Hong Kong for housing, meals, personal expenses, and vacation travel. The cost of these items varies significantly from one student to another, depending on your lifestyle, and travel plans. The cost is also affected by the changing value of the dollar. Use the figures below as a guide for your budget.
