The IU fees include tuition, fees, 2-3 group trips, health insurance during program dates, Colegio housing and some meals in September. In order for your family to take advantage of government tax-saver benefit plans, your total program fee is expressed as two separate charges on the IUB Bursar's invoice. The fees listed as "OVST fees-(IU admin program)" are the instructional fees that qualify as educational expenses. Those listed as "OVST Miscellaneous charges" include all non-instructional costs of the program, such as room, board and health insurance. Fall and spring fees must be paid by the deadlines specified on the electronic IUB Bursar's invoice. IUB financial aid will be reflected as a credit there. The March 3 prepayment will be applied to second semester fees.

II. Variable Program Costs

Variable costs are paid abroad as you purchase food and incidentals, pay rent, and travel. These costs vary significantly from student to student because they are based on individual spending habits and lifestyle. The dollar's value will also affect your costs for the year. Use them only as an approximate guide.

To estimate the cost of study abroad for you, add the resident or nonresident payment to IU to the lower end of the variable cost range if you know how to manage on a smaller budget, or to the higher end of the range if you plan extensive travel and want considerable freedom to purchase clothing and eat out

IU Withdrawal and Refund Policy

Students who withdraw from IU administered programs are responsible for non-recoverable costs. Your Bursar account will be assessed an additional charge to cover any/all amounts that Overseas Study has committed or paid on your behalf and are non-recoverable at the time of withdrawal, possibly including housing, meals, transportation, and faculty or staff compensation.
