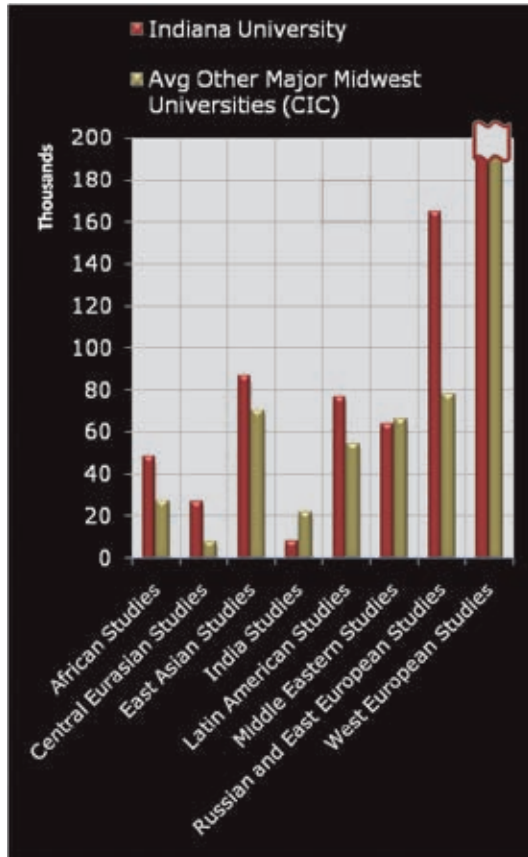


INDIANA UNIVERSITY LIBRARIES

The Indiana University Libraries have benefited from the university's century-long commitment to international study, most particularly its active leadership in Title VI programs. It boasts some of the Midwest's best collections in area studies, and superior collections of titles in languages other than English. With the advent of the web and electronic texts, libraries of the future will also need to demonstrate strength in more than their print materials. IU has made a major financial commitment to assure the availability of electronic journals associated with different regions of the world. IU-developed websites on international subjects are accessed from all over the world. To suggest the strength of its collections, IU is compared here to other institutions in the Committee for Institutional Cooperation (CIC). The CIC includes the Big Ten institutions as well as other major Midwestern academic centers.

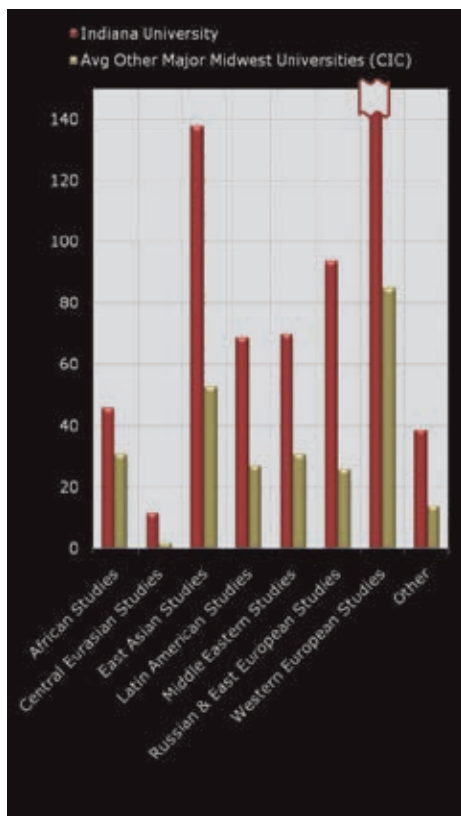

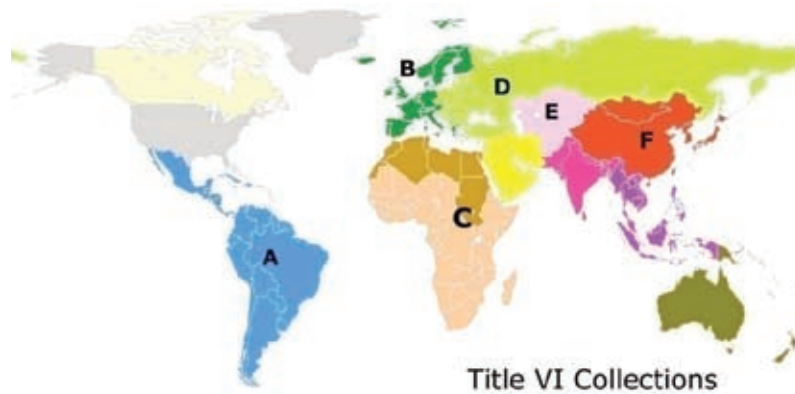
