

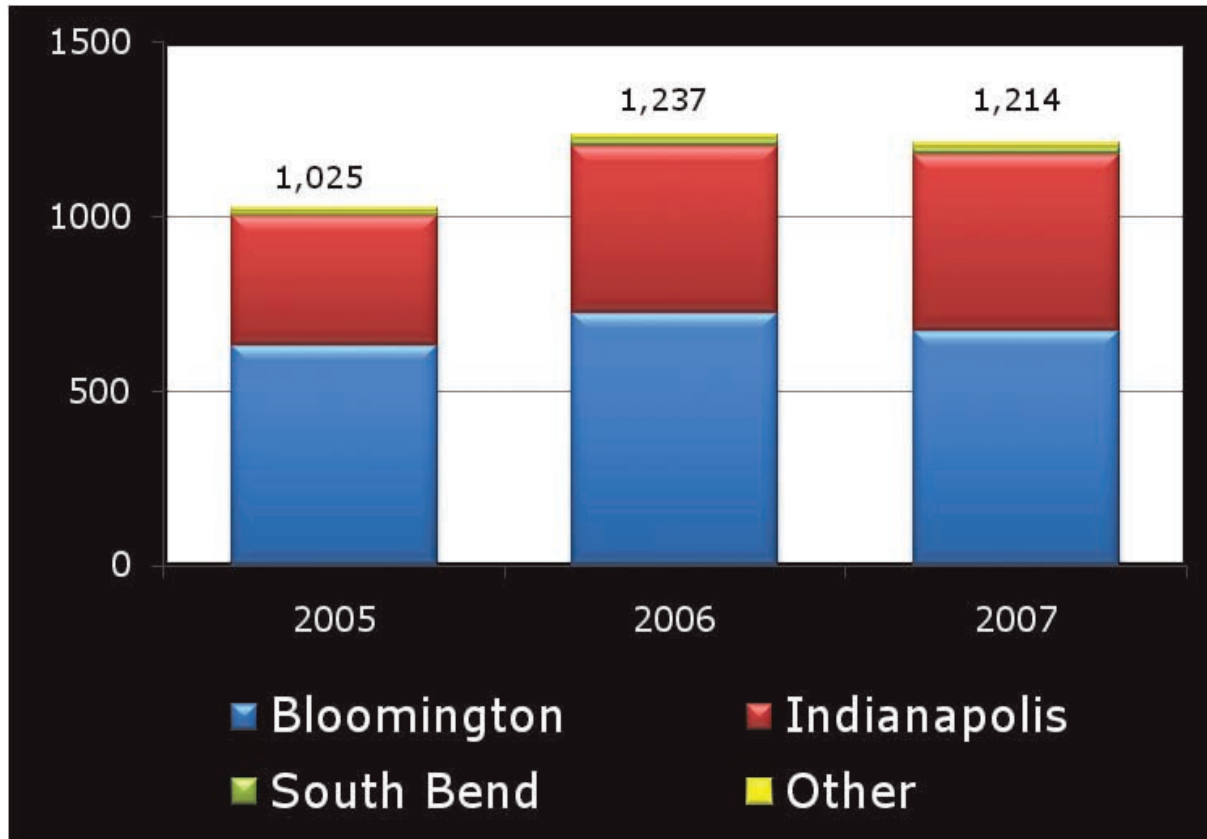
INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARS

Among the important international resources on campus are visitors from abroad. They may come to give a lecture, perform, participate in a workshop, or use the IU libraries. They may stay for longer periods to teach for a semester, or conduct research.

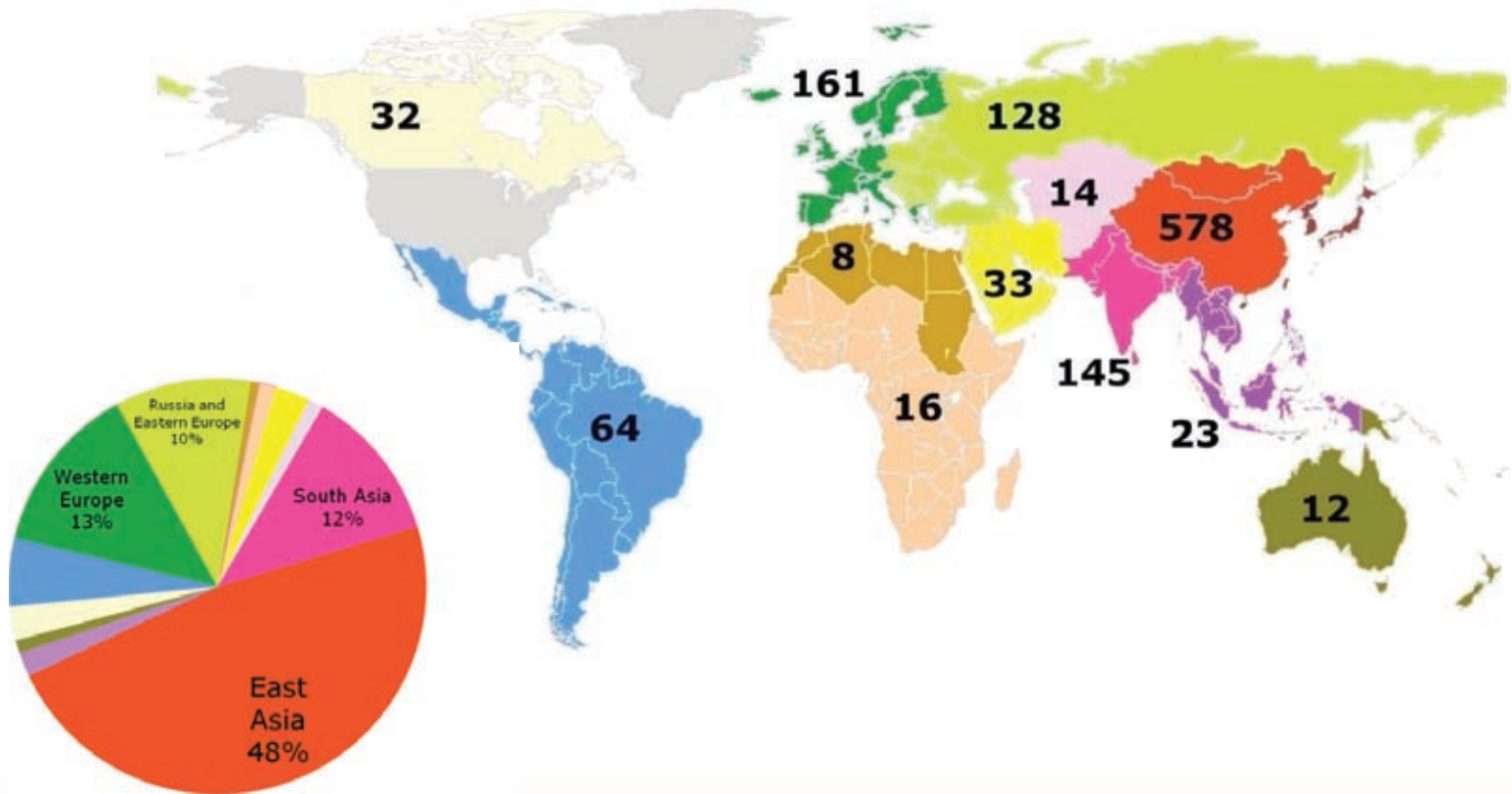
Hundreds of international guests come to IU each year on short-term B visas. They are not included in the totals that follow. However, many visitors, whose stays may range from two weeks to several years, come on visas administered by the Office of International Services (Bloomington) and International Affairs (Indianapolis). They represent a variety of visa types: H1-B (temporary worker specialty occupation), J-1 professor, researcher, specialist, or short-term scholar, O-1 (person of extraordinary ability) or TN (Trade NAFTA). INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARS' COUNTRIES OF CITIZENSHIP – IU SYSTEM 2007-08

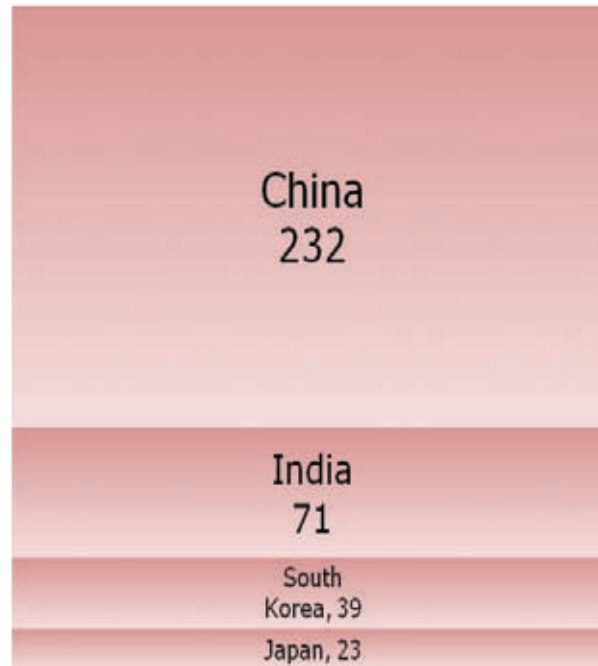


INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARS – TOP COUNTRIES OF CITIZENSHIP 2007-08

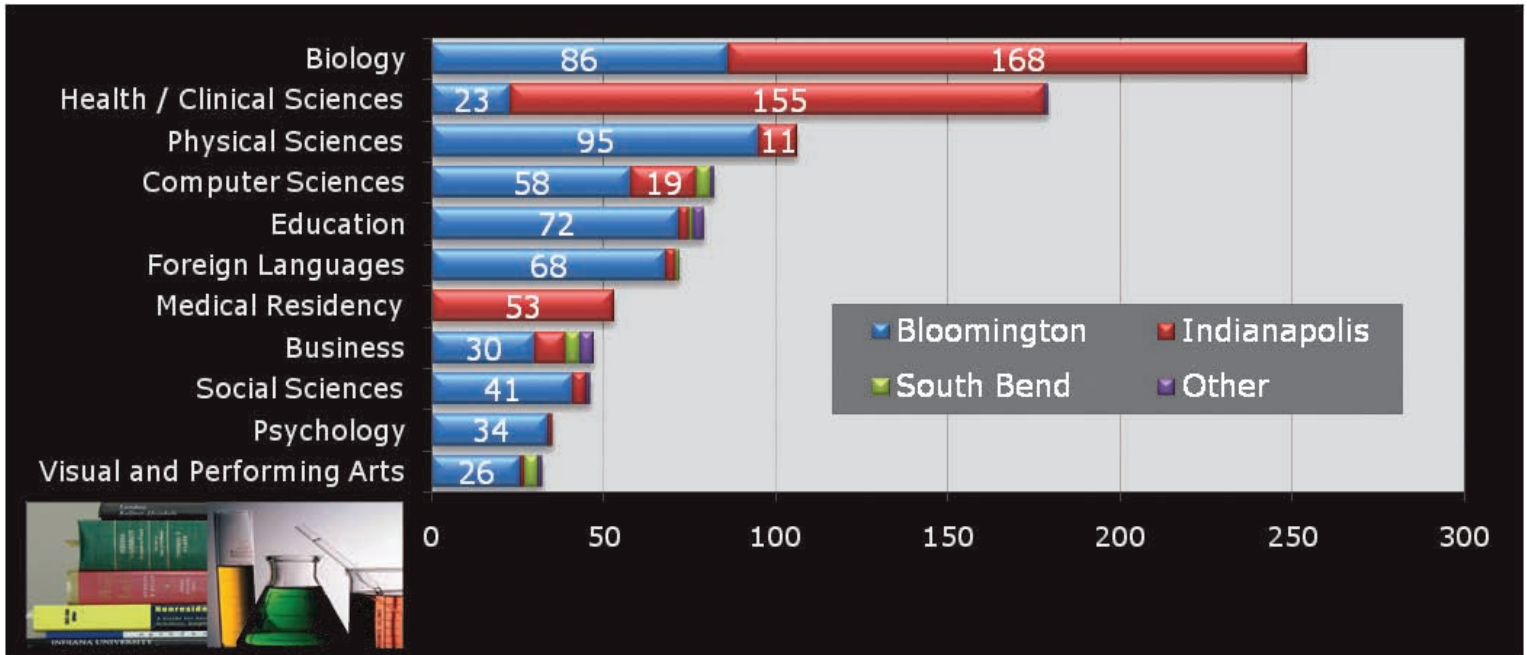
