



General Guidelines for Fulbright Applicants for 2011-2012 Grants

Description: The Institute of International Education (IIE), on behalf of the U.S. State Department, administers the Student Fulbright Program, which makes fellowships available to over 1,500 U.S. students annually to study, conduct research, teach English or train in the creative arts in more than 140 countries worldwide.

Eligibility Criteria: To apply for this program through Indiana University applicants must:

- (a) be IU students or alumni;
- (b) be U.S. citizens;
- (c) have completed an undergraduate degree by the beginning of the award.

Other requirements regarding language requirements or certifications are unique to each host country and applicants should carefully review them in the Country Summaries section of IIE's website:

Submission: In addition to their online application, applicants must submit the following application materials in hard copy:

- a completed **Application Form** (signed)
- a **Statement of Grant Purpose** (a maximum of 2 pages, single-spaced, 12-pt. font)
- a **Personal Statement** (a maximum of 1 page, single-spaced, 12-pt. font)
- **Three Letters of Recommendation** submitted BOTH electronically AND in hardcopy
- **Official Transcript(s)** for all undergraduate and graduate work (if any)
- a **Foreign Language Report**, if applying to a non-English-speaking country
- Original or faxed **Letter(s) of Affiliation** (if any)
