



ETHNOMUSICOLOGY VACANCY

The University of Dayton Department of Music is conducting a tenure-track search for an Ethnomusicologist at the Assistant Professor level.

Responsibilities will include developing and teaching Ethnomusicology courses, as well as coordinating and teaching in the core Musicology curriculum.

The University seeks a dynamic scholar-practitioner who will actively participate in existing interdisciplinary study programs, demonstrate a commitment to expand curricular offerings and visibility of the music of diverse cultures, and bring a new body of knowledge and world perspective to the Department.

The qualified candidate will have a terminal degree in Ethnomusicology by date of contract and expertise in a specialized field of Ethnomusicology. A strong foundation in music history in the Western tradition is required. S/he will demonstrate the potential for growth and distinction in teaching, research, publication; a commitment to remain active in professional organizations, and an understanding of effective teaching strategies for students of diverse backgrounds.

The successful candidate will assist with recruitment efforts and be engaged inservice to the Department of Music, the University, and the community. The ability to organize and lead experiential world music performance is desirable. Additional employment opportunities are available to teach in a summer graduate program.
