

## La Bonne Phrase

In La Bonne Phrase, the class writes a community sentence one word at a time. The first student begins the sentence with one word. The second student must either add another word or correct an error. Each student successively adds a word, corrects a mistake or closes the sentence on their turn.

**Example:**

Student #1:	<b>Cows</b>
Student #2:	<b>Old</b> cows
Student #3:	Old cows <b>jumps</b>
Student #4:	Old cows <b>jump</b>
Student #5:	Old cows jump <b>over</b>
Student #6:	Old cows jump over <b>chickens</b>
Student #7:	Old cows jump over <b>purple</b> chickens
Student #8:	Old cows jump over purple chickens!

Once the sentence is closed, we look for any errors, read the sentence aloud and talk about anything the students find confusing. This activity is a great way to review grammar and writing. The students enjoy finding fun vocabulary to use and are kept on their toes by not knowing what the person before them is going to do.
