MEN'S FACULTY CLUB

Sharon Brehm, IU Vice President of Academic Affairs and Chancellor of the Bloomington Campus, will speak on Wednesday, November 7, in the President's Room of the University Club. She will describe some of her new hopes for our campus and answer questions we might have. This luncheon will allow Club members to learn more about the chancellor's goals and priorities.

Brehm is the first woman to hold the position of IU-Bloomington Chancellor. IU officials say they selected Brehm because of her academic experience and her ability to work with colleagues to make important decisions. She came to Bloomington from Ohio University, where she had held the position of provost since 1996. Her responsibilities as provost included academic affairs and budget planning at the school of 19,000 students. Before that she served as dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at the State University of New York at Binghamton and associate dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences at the University of Kansas.

Brehm holds a Ph.D. degree in clinical psychology from Duke University and a master's degree in social relations from Harvard. She earned her bachelor's degree from Duke, where she graduated magna cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa.

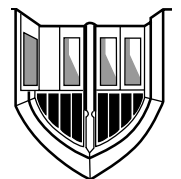
