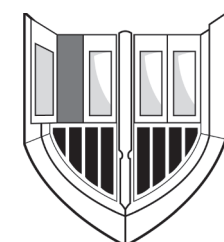

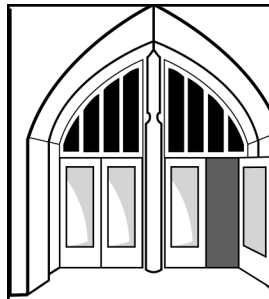

Antiques Group Spring Trip

Aurora, Indiana and Cincinnati, Ohio

Thursday, April 26, 2007



Itinerary:

- Board the bus between 8:00 a.m. and 8:25 a.m. We will depart at 8:30 a.m. sharp from the south side of Lot 4 at I.U. Memorial Stadium. Enter the lot from 17th Street. Please pick up your orange dashboard sign where you park your car. Carol Darling will provide coffee and a pastry.
- Our first stop will be a one-hour tour at 11 a.m. of Hillforest Mansion in Aurora, Indiana. Overlooking the Ohio River, Hillforest was the home of industrialist and financier Thomas Gaff and his family from 1855 to 1891. The Italian Renaissance architecture reflects the Gaff's business interests in shipping and riverboats. A sit-down lunch will be served in the mansion at 12:15.
- From there, we will continue to the Cincinnati Taft Museum for a one-hour tour at 2:30 p.m. The Museum was restored in 2004 at a cost of \$22 million. This grand house museum, set in 30-acre gardens, boasts collections of European paintings, Chinese porcelains and American and European furniture. After the tour you may view other exhibits in the home and tour the gardens on your own. We will leave at 4:30 p.m. Refreshments will be served on the bus. Our estimated time of arrival home will be 7:00 p.m.

The cost of the trip is \$55 per person and includes Star of America motorcoach, lunch at Hillforest Mansion, all admission fees and gratuity for bus driver.

Seats will be filled in order of checks received. Please sign up as early as possible because the bus company requires full payment a month in advance.

Trip to French Lick

Saturday, May 19

Our day trip to French Lick in West Baden Springs will be on Saturday, May 19. We will start with a coffee and pastry in the IU Memorial Stadium parking lot at 7:30 a.m. and depart at 8:00 a.m. sharp.



The trip will include a guided tour of the West Baden Springs Hotel and grounds, conducted by the Historic Landmarks Foundation of Indiana. The hotel is scheduled to be open on May 1 after its multi-million dollar renovation is complete.

There will be an optional two-hour train ride leaving from the Indiana Railway Museum, located between the two hotels.

Everyone will be free to tour the newly-renovated French Lick Hotel, its grounds and the nearby downtown on their own.

The casino will be open and admission is free. Playing the games is strictly optional.

Meals will be on your own. There will be a wide choice of restaurants at both hotels, including fine dining, large buffet and various others.

We will use the coach to move people between the two hotels and the train station.

Loading for the return trip will be at 4 p.m. Before leaving the area we will drive by the old golf course which is being returned to its 1920's configuration.

The trip will be hosted by Park Iler. Park will point out places of interest and comment on local history as well as the history of the hotels.

The price will be around \$45 dollars or less per person. A flyer with a registration form will be mailed out in early March.

George, Professor of Theatre and Drama and Head of the B.F.A. in Musical Theatre, has directed and/or choreographed over 150 musical theatre productions for national and international tours, regional and university theatres including the IU Department of Theatre and Drama's production of *Urinetown* last semester. Recognized for his teaching, George was awarded the Friedrich Herman Lieber Award for Distinguished Teaching, 5 Board of Trustees Awards for Excellence in Teaching and membership in the Faculty Colloquium of Excellence in Teaching.

Allison Moody is a second year M.F.A. student in Acting who recently received her B.F.A. from Drake University. IU credits include Meg in *The Birthday Party*, Liz Morden in *Our Country's Good*, and Dr. Charlotte in *Falsettos* and Maura in *Reel*. Additional training includes Improv Olympic and The Audition Studio in Chicago and the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts. She is from Stilwell, Kansas.

If hiking off the usual paths interests you, join Eleanor Lahr and others as we check out the hikes in Alan McPherson's *Nature Walks in Southern Indiana*. Hikes vary in length and difficulty, such as: short and easy (1 mi.) – Pioneer Mothers, moderate (4 mi.) – Deam Wilderness wildflowers, or a work-out (10 mi.) on a segment of the Knobstone Trail.

Suggested hike for April 21, 2007
Deam Wilderness, Hayes Trail
Distance: 5 - 6 miles



It's not in Alan McPherson's book, but it's a trail I never miss each spring. After the first quarter mile you leave the sound of cars on 446 and drop into another world of hills and streams and emerging life. Among the wild blue phlox, trillium, fire pinks, jack-in-the-pulps is (if you know where to look) one of the largest patches of blue bells I've ever seen. Slow down, breath and soak in the beauty. Bring your camera. We'll stop as often as necessary. Because the trail is so clear, you could come and do a mile or two, then turn back on your own. Bring snacks and water. Leave K-Mart/Bloomington parking lot at 9 a.m. Back about 1:00 p.m.
