BOARD NOTES

The University Club Board met on Friday, March 13th. The agenda included several important issues.

1. Problems resulting from the existence of hundreds of keys to the club rooms were discussed. The club keys are in the possession of many current and prior members. There have been several incidents that have indicated a change is needed to provide security for the Club rooms and privacy for other organizations who rent our space. Accordingly, the board decided that the club room locks will be changed. Any member, such as program chairs, may get a key from Sheila prior to any specific need and any member may pick up a key for an occasion of use at the hotel desk (open 24 hours a day) to come into the Club after the office staff has left for the day. The sitting room continues to be available for members to use at any time; the pool room and library are also available at any time they have not been reserved by a member or others. Members must honor the privacy of club room renters and may participate in club events only in accord with the arrangements for the event. These steps will greatly improve security of the club rooms without limiting member access.

2. We reviewed a new set of bylaws for the now merged Women's Faculty & Staff Club with the Men's Faculty Club. We welcome the newly formed group to the umbrella of the University Club. The merger resolves the gender issue in these clubs' names as well as broadening the pool of leadership and re-energizing the faculty/staff representation in the Club. This new club will assure the continuation of programming focused on the special interests of men and women and all faculty and staff members; these programs continue to be open to all UClub members.

3. The university has indicated that a new occupancy arrangement with the IMU may be timely. There is no definite decision regarding terms; discussions with IMU are continuing. Information for all members concerning any arrangement will be provided when available.

4. We reviewed the bylaws revisions for the University Club. These will be voted on at the annual meeting. Anyone may review the bylaws revisions by clicking on this link.

I have also been notified that Gene and Jan Coyle decided not to accept their nominations as Vice-President/President-Elect of the club. We are now looking for someone or a couple who will consider stepping into this position. Please contact me if you are willing and/or if you know someone who would be a good candidate to fill this position. The Club depends on volunteers to plan the many programs it provides to both the IU and Bloomington communities. It is really where Town and Gown meet.

Lunch with Wonderlab's Victoria Rodgers



Victoria Rodgers is the Education Director for the Wonderlab Museum located at 308 W. 4th Street in Bloomington.

HISTORY WonderLab was the inspiration of Debra Kent, a Bloomington journalist and mother, who gathered a small group of like-minded individuals in late 1994 to talk about creating a hands-on science museum in Bloomington. The following year WonderLab was incorporated under the laws of Indiana, obtained 501(c) (3) non-profit status and began operation as a traveling outreach program run by dedicated volunteers.

On January 10, 1998, WonderLab opened a small, interim museum on the north side of the Bloomington courthouse square. At the same time, fundraising began to build a permanent museum on the present site, which the city of Bloomington had donated the previous year for the purpose.

The current award-winning museum opened to the public on March 29, 2003. It remains a grassroots organization supported by hundreds of volunteers, staffed by many individuals who nurtured it from its beginnings and treasured it as a valuable asset by the community.

MISSION WonderLab is a private 501(c) (3) non-profit organization whose mission is to provide opportunities for people of all ages, especially children, to experience the wonder and excitement of science through hands-on exhibits and programs that stimulate curiosity, encourage exploration, and foster lifelong learning. We will visit the Lincoln Presidential Museum, the Lincoln Home Visitor's Center and the Lincoln Home National Historic Site, a restored four-block neighborhood with a quaint, Quaker-brown residence - the only home Lincoln ever owned - and the home of the Lincoln family for 17 years (1844-1861) - as its centerpiece. We will also visit the Old State Capital, attend a special Civil War Retreat ceremony at the Lincoln Tomb, tour the Executive Mansion (home of seven former U.S. Presidents), the Dana Thomas Home (Frank Lloyd Wright Home) and visit New Salem State Park, a living history pioneer village that will take us back to Lincoln's life in the 1830's. We will visit Colonel Jones Home, a restored 1834 Federal-design home of the merchant employer of Abraham Lincoln; and the Lincoln Pioneer Village. We will have dinner and see the play LINCOLN at the new Lincoln Amphitheatre, which will include an Amish family style meal, artisans on site, Lincoln archives, and a theatrical play about his life. During intermission we will have free, unlimited soft drinks and popcorn. Return around 11:30 p.m. Price of \$60 for UClub members and \$62 for non-members includes transportation, escort, all tours, and dinner show.

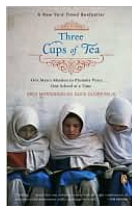

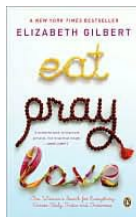
