Indianapolis, Indiana

Thursday, April 27, 2006

Itinerary:

- Board the bus between 7:30 a.m. and 7:55 a.m. We will depart at 8:00 a.m. sharp from the south side of Lot 4 at I.U. Memorial Stadium. Enter the lot from 17th Street. Please pick up your orange dashboard sign where you park your car. Carol Darling will provide coffee and a pastry.
- Our first stop will be a tour of the James Whitcomb Riley Museum Home in the historic Lockerbie Square for an hour tour at 10 a.m. Hoosier poet James Whitcomb Riley spent the last 23 years of his life here. One of the finest Victorian preservations in the United States, many of Riley's personal belongings are showcased here. Riley penned many famous poems, including "Little Orphan Annie."
- Next, it's on to the Scottish Rite Cathedral for a hour tour at 11:30 a.m. During its early days, the Tudor-Gothic style cathedral was considered one of the world's most beautiful buildings.
- From there, we will continue on to the Indianapolis Museum of Art for lunch at 1 p.m. A buffet lunch will be served in the Deer-Zink Pavilion looking out on the water fountain. We will have a guided tour of the new galleries at 2:30 p.m., and later leave for Bloomington at 5 p.m.
- The cost for the trip is \$45 and includes Star of America motor-coach, buffet lunch by Wolfgang Puck at the Indianapolis Museum, all fees and admission for tour sites and gratuity.

Accordion concert by Svetla Vladeva to follow dinner.

Born in Kazanlak, Bulgaria in 1974, Svetla began playing piano-accordion at the age of eight. By the end of high school, she had earned three first place finishes, one second place and one third place in the International Accordion Competition for her solo and duet performances. She was the first person to receive the award for best in musical achievement and excellence as the top graduate of the six high schools in Kazanlak. She began a self-learning program on the play of the bayan (button accordion) at the start of her university studies. She was the third accordion player ever to learn and perform with the bayan accordion in Bulgaria. Svetla received a bachelor's degree in Music Education from the University of Plovdiv, majoring in accordion and piano. She then moved to the United States in 1997.

Svetla's passion for various musical genres has given her the freedom to perform a wide range of musical pieces with their variations to include original music and transcriptions from other instruments. Her personal repertoire includes music written by Bach, Scarlatti, Mozart, Brahms, Balkan folk, Gypsy, Cajun, Zydaco, as well as contemporary and popular dance. Her extraordinary virtuoso techniques and pure musical talent have enabled her to perform in previously uncharted areas in the music world through the play of the bayan accordion.

President's State of U Club Address

Looking back on the past two years, we reflect on some of the events that have taken place. The programs have been varied and interesting from the Fall Welcome Reception (which was well attended) to the Churchill Downs trip we are anticipating this spring.

Membership is strong with 960 paid members. The bad news is, some shifting from family to single membership. Dues collection has exceeded the annual budget estimate, however. The Treasurer reports some good news in December, but the financial needs arose due to need for still more staff time and the purchase of a new banquet table for the Presidents' Room.

Our constituent clubs have done well and scheduled many activities and meetings that received good attendance. They also sponsor a large number of interest groups. The Web site continues to draw more and more attention.

Room rental was increased slightly this year for members and non-members. The charges for members will change as follows: The Presidents' Room rent will go from \$60 to \$80, for six-hour events, and from \$100 to \$120 for twelve-hour events. The Faculty Room rent will go from \$60 to \$70 for six hours, and from \$100 to \$110 for twelve hours. The charges for private functions have changed also. The Faculty Room will go from \$75 to \$100 for six hours and from \$125 to \$150 for twelve hours.

This year our scholarship help for students employed by IMU has been increased to \$750.

Jim Berbeco, who has been the Vice President and President Elect this year, will step in to the Presidency for 2006-07 in June of 2006. Jim and the rest of the board will be setting up committees and working on a budget and programs for next year during April and May in anticipation of the "Changing of the Guard."

We want to thank all of you who have made our two years so enjoyable. Our Board has been exceptional with attendance and enthusiasm. This made the job so much easier.

of the National Geographic Society News Service, a joint venture with *The New York Times* and the Associated Press. Raymer is the author and photographer of *St. Petersburg*, a 1994 illustrated book about the imperial Russian capital, and *Living Faith: Inside the Muslim World of Southeast Asia*, published in 2001. He also is the photographer of *Land of the Ascending Dragon: Rediscovering Vietnam* (1997) and *The Vietnamese Cookbook* (1999). Raymer is currently completing a new book about the Indian Diaspora — a project that has taken him to more than 15 countries. Indiana University Press will publish *India Abroad: Images of a Journey* in 2007.

The National Press Photographers Association has named Raymer "Magazine Photographer of the Year" — one of photojournalism's most coveted awards. He has received a citation for excellence in foreign reporting from the Overseas Press Club and is a four-time winner of first-prize awards from the White House News Photographers' Association. Raymer also received a Fulbright Research Fellowship from the U.S. State Department.

Speaker: Professor Steve Raymer

Topic: **"Living Faith: Inside the Muslim World of Southeast Asia"**

Professor Raymer will talk about his experiences in interviewing and photographing Muslims in several countries of Southeast Asia which led to the publication of a book in 2001. Professor Raymer's journalistic work in the Muslim world took place before 9/11 and he was able to travel, interview and photograph freely in Southeast Asia, something that he could not do today. His inside description of the Muslim world is greatly enhanced by his photographs which are the feature attraction of his book.



Professor Steve Raymer, a *National Geographic* Magazine staff photographer for more than two decades, teaches photojournalism, media ethics and international news gathering at Indiana University in Bloomington. He is also on the faculty of the university's Russian and East European Institute.

Raymer earned B.S. and M.A. degrees at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and studied Soviet and Russian affairs at Stanford University as a John S. Knight Journalism Fellow. After service as a Lieutenant in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War, he joined the staff of *National Geographic* in 1972, launching a career that has taken him to more than 85 countries. From famines in Bangladesh and Ethiopia to the collapse of the Soviet Union, Raymer's photographs have illustrated some 30 *National Geographic* articles. From 1991 to 1995, Raymer also was the director

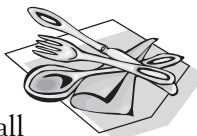
