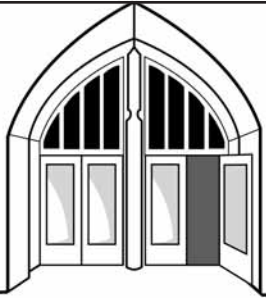

McRobbie as Interim Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs, Bloomington, effective February 1, 2006. *Business Review.* Besides continuing to follow lobbying in general, his new book project examines how China is adapting to and learning the rules of the game of various international regimes, including those for fair trade, technical standards and credit rating.

Kennedy received a Ph.D. in political science from George Washington University in 2002, an M.A. in international relations from Johns Hopkins University's Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced International Studies in 1992, and a B.A. in foreign affairs from University of Virginia in 1989. From 1993 to 1997, he was a research assistant at the Brookings Institution in Washington, DC. He has lived in China off and on for four years since the late 1980s, including a year at the Stanford Center (1989-90) and one at the Hopkins-Nanjing Center (1991-92), and has traveled throughout East Asia.

Kennedy is a native of Washington, DC. His neglected hobbies include beer can collecting and basketball. He is married to Mary Beth Kennedy, an environmental consultant. They have three children.

**Speaker: Cathy Rogers**, long-time Director of VITAL-Volunteers in Tutoring Adult Learners

**Topic: "Literacy: Where Do We Go from Here?"**

Think you don't know anyone who is illiterate? Think again. Some 15,000 people who can't read live in Monroe County!

Perhaps you have sat next to someone in a restaurant who takes only a fleeting glance at the menu and then asks the waiter or waitress what the specials are. This may be just what it seems-someone looking for advice about what is especially good. Or it could be something quite different. This is a technique that people who cannot read use when they are in restaurants-both to get the ordering done and not to embarrass themselves or others.

Rogers will take a look at where we have been with respect to literacy, where we are going and what the new trends show. And we do have a long way to go in the Bloomington area. Not only are there more than 15,000 people in this community who cannot read, write or do numbers, but in addition there are 10,000 to 12,000 people who are marginally illiterate, meaning they can read some of the words but often don't understand what they are reading.

To help ease this problem in the Bloomington area, VITAL, which is a program of the Monroe County Public Library, began in 1977 to assist the many residents of the county with below average literacy skills. Thanks to the support of the library and the Monroe County community as a whole, VITAL has grown in size and in scope. The VITAL program provides free and confidential one-on-one tutoring to adults who wish to improve their reading skills, but has grown to offer many more programs such as instruction for the High School Equivalency Test and tutoring English as a second language.

Rogers has seen it all during her years as director of the program and will share her insights with the University Women's Club members at this program.

- From there, we will continue on to the Indianapolis Museum of Art for lunch at 1 p.m. A buffet lunch will be served in the Deer-Zink Pavilion looking out on the water fountain. We will have a guided tour of the new galleries at 2:30 p.m., and later leave for Bloomington at 5 p.m.

**Guest Speaker:** Dr. Scott Kennedy, an Assistant Professor of East Asian Languages and Cultures and Adjunct Assistant Professor of Political Science, Indiana University

**Topic:** "The Chinese Dragon: Economic Competitor and Military Threat?"

Dr. Kennedy will discuss the current state of relations between the United States and China, focusing on the tensions between the simultaneous expansion of cooperative business ties between the two countries and the growing fears among Americans about an emerging new superpower that potentially threatens America's global leadership.

Scott Kennedy conducts research on and teaches about East Asian politics and political economy at Indiana University, where he is an assistant professor in the Department of East Asian Languages and Cultures and an adjunct assistant professor in the Department of Political Science. His just-published book, *The Business of Lobbying in China* (Harvard University Press, February 2005), documents the growing influence of domestic and foreign businesses on national economic policy in China, and also shows that although companies operate in a common political system, economic circumstances shape the nature and outcome of lobbying. Kennedy also recently edited *China Cross Talk: The American Debate over China Policy since Normalization, A Reader* (Rowman & Littlefield, 2003), an anthology of op-eds, congressional testimony, speeches and editorial cartoons that present the most memorable scenes from the debate of the past quarter century. Kennedy has published articles in *World Policy Journal*, *The China Journal*, *The China Quarterly*, *Problems of Post-Communism*, *Financial Times*, *Asian Wall Street Journal*, and *China*
