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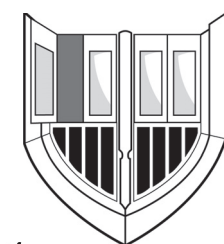
Reminder: 2005 Mini University, June 19-24

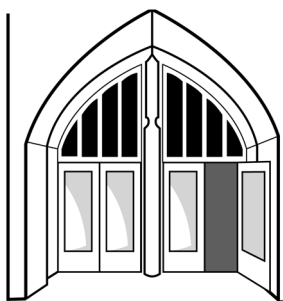

Antiques Group Spring Trip

Louisville, Kentucky
Thursday, April 28, 2005

Itinerary:

- Board the bus between 7:00 a.m. and 7:25 a.m. We will depart at 7:30 a.m. sharp from the south side of Lot 4 at IU Memorial Stadium. Enter the lot from 17th Street. Please pick up your orange dashboard sign when you park your car. Carol Darling will provide coffee and a pastry.
- Our first stop will be a tour of Farmington. Farmington is a 14 room Federal-style house that was the center of the 19th century hemp plantation of John and Lucy Speed. The design is based on a plan by Thomas Jefferson and was completed in 1816. The tour will start when we arrive and a box lunch will be provided at 12:30 p.m. in the garden (or the carriage house in case of rain).
- We leave at 1:30 p.m. for the Kentucky Museum of Arts and Design. We will have an hour to explore the Museum. The bus will leave for the Speed Museum at 3 p.m.
- The Speed Museum staff will give us a guided tour of the special exhibit "Capturing Western Legends: Russell and Remington and the Canadian West." We depart at 5 p.m.
- We will stop at the Third Avenue Cafe near the Speed Museum for a hot drink and dessert before we depart for Bloomington. Please indicate cake preference:

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Spring Trip to Lexington, Kentucky

Friday- Saturday, May 20-21, 2005

Itinerary:

- Board the Star of America motor coach at 7:30 a.m. at Football Stadium Lot 4. Coffee, tea, and bon voyage treats provided.
- Walking tour of the Gratz Park Historic area with two museums and much more. Lunch at the Gratz Park Inn (included)
- Visit "Ashland," the home and gardens of Henry Clay. In addition to his illustrious career in politics, Henry Clay was a pioneer in thoroughbred breeding. (admission and tour included)
- Special evening at spectacular Spindletop Hall, the horse farm mansion operated by the University of Kentucky. We will have an outstanding dinner with wine (included). Cash bar in the Saddle Horse Lounge with snacks will be available prior to dinner.
- Early Saturday, we venture to Keeneland racetrack where we will experience the unique sights and sounds of horses. Enjoy a sumptuous breakfast at the Keeneland Track Kitchen, a gathering place for jockeys, trainers and owners. (included)
- The afternoon will be spent at the Kentucky Horse Park, the only theme park dedicated to the horse (admission and tour included). There are museums, galleries, farm exhibits and over 40 breeds of horses. The Horse Park has a restaurant for those who may want a snack. (NOT included)
- We depart in the late afternoon for our return to Bloomington with an on-board box supper included along with some soothing libations.
- We intend to arrive in Bloomington around 8 p.m. (in May, Kentucky may be an hour ahead of Indiana so we may arrive earlier).

Our guest will be **Dr. Joan Austin** speaking on "Research in the School of Nursing."



Dr. Austin is a distinguished professor of nursing in the School of Nursing at the Indiana University of Nursing in Indianapolis, where she has taught since 1981. She also holds adjunct appointments in the Psychiatry department, Indiana University School of Medicine and in the Psychology department at Purdue University School of Science. Dr. Austin is the principal investigator for the Center for Enhancing Quality of Life in Chronic Illness in the nursing research center at Indiana University School of Nursing. She is a member of the Institute of Medicine, the Professional Advisory Board of the Epilepsy Foundation and the Research Commission of the International Bureau for Epilepsy. Dr. Austin is second vice president of the American Epilepsy Society and in 2005 will become the first nurse to serve as president of that organization.

This month **Timothy T. Baldwin**, Professor of Management & Subhedar Faculty Fellow, IU Kelley School of Business will speak on the following subject:

"If You Really Want to Understand Something, Try to Change it . . ."

Making a change, whether it be personal, group or organizational, is exceedingly difficult. The number of people who keep their New Year's resolutions or lose and keep off weight is staggeringly low. Beating the odds and achieving successful change requires an understanding of the nature of the change process and the skills needed to overcome different elements of resistance. In this presentation you will learn the factors common to all successful change initiatives and some creative illustrations of change that really worked.

Professor Baldwin's research has focused on effective human resource management and particularly within the areas of management development and HRM in small business. He is a prolific writer and has published his research work in leading academic and professional outlets such as: Journal of Applied Psychology, Personnel Psychology, Academy of Management Journal, Training and Development Journal and Human Resource Development Quarterly. He has won several national research awards including three from the National Academy of Management (the premier association of management professors) and the Richard A. Swanson Excellence in Research Award presented by the American Society for Training & Development (ASTD).

The University Women's Club is delighted to welcome members of the University Club to a wide variety of interest groups. These groups help form the foundation for friendships and learning that create enriching experiences.

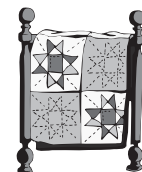

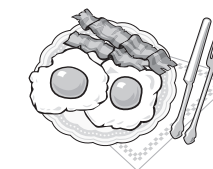

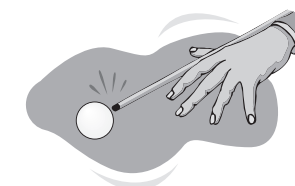
THE BREAKFAST BUNCH INTEREST GROUP
