Antiques Trip - April 25 & 26



ITINERARY:

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-  We'll board the bus at 8:00 a.m. and leave Bloomington at 8:30 a.m., sharp from the south side of Lot 4 at Indiana Memorial Stadium. Dashboard signs and required luggage tags will be available when you park your car.
 -  Expected arrival at Pleasant Hill is 12:30 p.m., on our trip back in time to the Shakers' utopian community. After our Shaker-style lunch, we'll tour the historic restored buildings and enjoy trade and craft demonstrations and a music performance. (We will not have access to our rooms until after the tour.) Our supper will be followed by an evening bonfire and storytelling.
 -  After breakfast on Saturday, we'll board the bus for the Kentucky River and our cruise on the Dixie Belle, weather permitting. We'll learn about how the Shakers used the river, flora and fauna and the geology of the spectacular palisades of the river. Bring your cameras!
 -  A half-hour scenic bus ride will bring us to Danville, which boasts more historic buildings than any other Kentucky town. After an introductory bus tour, we'll see Constitution Square. We'll have a box lunch, and then visit the McDowell House and Apothecary built circa 1790. We'll stop for dinner (on your own), and return to Bloomington at 9:00 p.m.

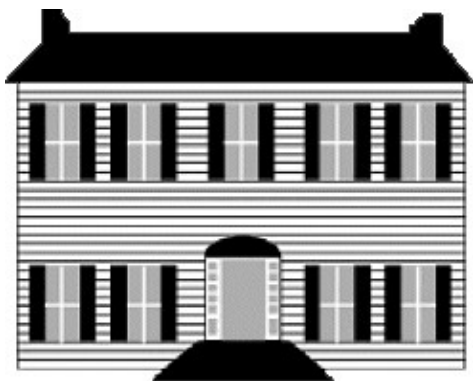
Pleasant Hill, Kentucky

Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill is America's largest restored Shaker community, with 34 carefully restored buildings and 3,000 acres of preserved farmland. The village is also home to more than 25 miles of striking rock fences, the most extensive collection remaining in Kentucky today.

The buildings, countryside and historical records of this celebrated National Historic Landmark are preserved and maintained for the educational, cultural and recreational use by the local community, people of Kentucky and all visitors to the site.

Danville, Kentucky

Constitution Square was the site of a series of important events in Kentucky's history: the ten constitutional conventions that led to Kentucky's statehood. Frontier statesmen who lived in what was then the Kentucky County of Virginia struggled more than eight years for independence. Finally, on June 1, 1792, Kentucky became the fifteenth state in the Union and Isaac Shelby, a Revolutionary War hero and convention delegate, was named the first governor of the new Commonwealth.
