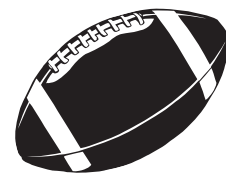

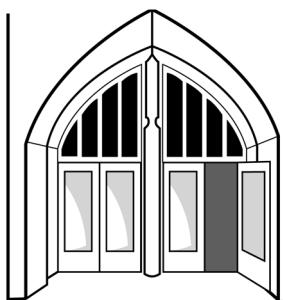

Our Annual Meeting will feature IU's new Head Football Coach Terry Hooppner as the speaker.

Hooppner arrives in Bloomington after spending 19 seasons at Miami, including the past six as head coach. During his head coaching tenure, Hooppner helped restore the national spotlight to the tradition-rich RedHawk football program. In addition to compiling a 48-24 overall record, Miami has finished among the top three in the MAC East each of the last six years. The RedHawks closed the 2003 season by winning the MAC and GMAC Bowl Championships and were ranked 10th in the final Associated Press poll and 12th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll. In addition, Miami was rated as high as 11th in the Bowl Championship Series.

Find out firsthand what coach Hooppner plans to do to revitalize the IU program and what you as fans can do to put us back in the national spotlight. This is your opportunity to ask questions and get answers directly from the new boss!

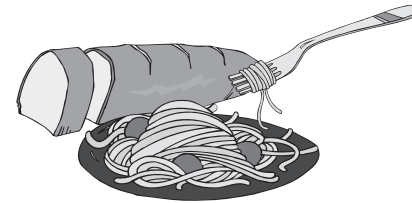
Dr. David Gallahue, Dean of the School of HPER, Professor of Kinesiology will speak on **"Living Well through Healthy Lifestyles."**

He is the author of numerous textbooks and presides over the third largest School at IU. Dr. Gallahue is speaking on Wellness - A Healthy Life Style.

David Gallahue is an administrator and faculty member with more than 30 years of experience with the Indiana University School of Health, Physical Education and Recreation (HPER). His research areas include children's physical activity, motor performance, childhood obesity intervention, youth sport delivery systems and children's hero choices. He has served as a consultant to governing bodies of the U.S. Olympic Committee that deal with gymnastics and skiing. HPER was established in 1946 as the first school of its kind in the United States. It has grown to be one of the largest, with some 2,000 undergraduate and graduate students, 72 faculty members and more than 100 staff members. Gallahue's service with IU and HPER has included such areas as strategic planning, faculty governance, international programs, research, tenure and promotions, administrative structure and student recruitment and retention.

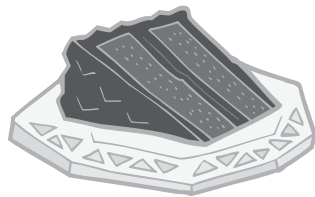
"If You Really Want to Understand Something, Try to Change it . . ."

Making a change, whether it be personal, group or organizational, is exceedingly difficult. The number of people who keep their New Year's resolutions or lose and keep off weight is staggeringly low. Beating the odds and achieving successful change requires an understanding of the nature of the change process and the skills needed to overcome different elements of resistance. In this presentation you will learn the factors common to all successful change initiatives and some creative illustrations of change that really worked.

Professor Baldwin's research has focused on effective human resource management and particularly within the areas of management development and HRM in small business. He is a prolific writer and has published his research work in leading academic and professional outlets such as: Journal of Applied Psychology, Personnel Psychology, Academy of Management Journal, Training and Development Journal and Human Resource Development Quarterly. He has won several national research awards including three from the National Academy of Management (the premier association of management professors) and the Richard A. Swanson Excellence in Research Award presented by the American Society for Training & Development (ASTD).

We will hear **Derek Fullerton** speaking on "The History of DIAMONDS"

Derek is an Irish citizen, having been born of Irish parents in Johannesburg, South Africa. He was educated in South Africa where he obtained degrees in Mining and Geology.

From 1964 until 1980 Derek was involved in diamond exploration throughout the African continent. At various times he was based in South Africa, Swaziland, Botswana, Namibia, Angola, Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, and Morocco. In 1980 Derek and his wife Hilda and their children moved to the United States of America to commence a diamond exploration program for a Belgian mining company. Headquarters for these operations were established in Bloomington from where operations were conducted in 17 states. These operations were terminated in 2001 where after Derek became an independent consultant and remained active in the field of diamond exploration.

His principal non-geological interests are photography, thematic philately and pre-1930 automobiles. He is a member of the Bloomington North Rotary Club, a board member of the Foundation of MCCSC and Boy Scouts of America.
