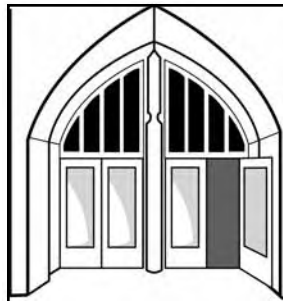

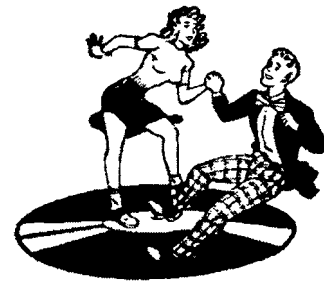

Speaker: Doris Sims, Program Manager, Workforce & Economic Development, Ivy Tech Community College
Topic: "Ivy Tech Community College – Changing Lives"

During her 25 years of public sector leadership, Doris Sims has been helping make Bloomington and surrounding areas a better place to live. A graduate of IU's School of Public and Environmental Affairs, she has served as both Personnel Director and Executive Director of Housing and Neighborhood Development for the City of Bloomington. In the latter position, she helped improve city neighborhoods, increased neighborhood participation in city government and created the successful city course, "Citizen Academy," which outlines city services.

From 2000-2002, she served as Executive Director of the Bloomington Urban Enterprise Association, where she oversaw the development of new programs and activities for business and residents living in the Enterprise Zone. From 2002-2005, she was Region 10 Director for the Indiana Department of Commerce, where she developed partnerships with regional business and community development organizations and leaders and succeeded in increasing economic and community development services to the region by 220%.

In her current position as Program Manager for Workforce & Economic Development at Ivy Tech Community College, Doris coordinates training activities for 30 local businesses, helps develop, plan and organize training in multidisciplinary subjects, and fosters community relationships in support of Ivy Tech.

Throughout its history, Ivy Tech Community College has had a single mission – to help people develop themselves educationally, and in so doing, to help communities in Indiana grow and prosper. In this talk, the speaker will present an overview of the academic and non-academic programs that the college provides for continuing education and community involvement, including exciting new community programs such as The O'Bannon Institute.

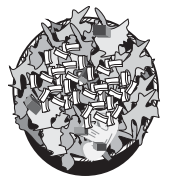

Speaker: Dr. Kenneth (Ken) R. R. Gros Louis, Chancellor of the Bloomington Campus

Topic: "The Current and Future State of Liberal Education" - Dr. Gros Louis will provide his analysis of where a liberal education fits in the priorities of higher education today, especially in public universities. He will talk about the pressures and issues affecting the goals and quality of liberal arts and the humanities on campuses today.

After serving as Chancellor of the Bloomington campus from 1980 to 2001, Dr. Ken Gros Louis was called out of retirement to serve as Interim Chancellor. In the recent reorganization of the University administrative structure, a Provost position was established for the Bloomington campus and the Chancellor position was eliminated. In the restructuring, Dr. Gros Louis was named Chancellor of the Indiana University system and joined Herman B Wells as the only two persons to hold that title. Dr. Gros Louis joined the faculty of Indiana University as an assistant professor in 1964 and was promoted to an associate professor of English and Comparative Literature in 1967. He was associate chairman of the Comparative Literature department, associate dean of Arts and Sciences, chairman of the English department and dean of Arts and Sciences before being named Vice President for Academic Affairs for the Indiana University campus system and Chancellor of the Bloomington campus in 1980. Dr. Gros Louis has a B.A. degree from Columbia University in 1959, an M.A. from Columbia in 1960 and a Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin in 1964. His numerous and varied academic organization memberships and recognitions and his distinguished administrative experience make him well qualified to talk about the place of liberal education in today's society.

What's so funny about artists? If you were an English or American cartoonist in the nineteenth or twentieth century, the answer would be: almost everything. This talk discusses how and why the modern artist became a figure of fun, and what this kind of humor says about the place of art in modern, commercial society.

Sarah Burns (Ph.D., University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign) is Ruth N. Halls Professor of Fine Arts at Indiana University, Bloomington. She is the author of *Pastoral Inventions: Rural Life in Nineteenth-Century American Art and Culture* (Temple University Press, 1989) and *Inventing the Modern Artist: Art and Culture in Gilded Age America* (Yale University Press, 1996), and *Painting the Dark Side: Art and the Gothic Imagination in Nineteenth-Century America* (University of California Press, 2004).

Itinerary:

- Board the bus between 7:30 a.m. and 7:55 a.m. We will depart at 8:00 a.m. sharp from the south side of Lot 4 at I.U. Memorial Stadium. Enter the lot from 17th Street. Please pick up your orange dashboard sign where you park your car. Carol Darling will provide coffee and a pastry.
- Our first stop will be a tour of the James Whitcomb Riley Museum Home in the historic Lockerbie Square for an hour tour at 10 a.m. Hoosier poet James Whitcomb Riley spent the last 23 years of his life here. One of the finest Victorian preservations in the United States, many of Riley's personal belongings are showcased here. Riley penned many famous poems, including "Little Orphan Annie."
- Next, it's on to the Scottish Rite Cathedral for a hour tour at 11:30 a.m. During its early days, the Tudor-Gothic style cathedral was considered one of the world's most beautiful buildings.
- From there, we will continue on to the Indianapolis Museum of Art for lunch at 1 p.m. A buffet lunch will be served in the Deer-Zink Pavilion looking out on the water fountain. We will have a guided tour of the new galleries at 2:30 p.m., and later leave for Bloomington at 5 p.m.
- The cost for the trip is \$45 and includes Star of America motor-coach, buffet lunch by Wolfgang Puck at the Indianapolis Museum, all fees and admission for tour sites, and gratuity.
- The Star of America, for the first time, wants to be paid in full 30 days in advance. So this year, everyone may sign up for the trip at the same time. 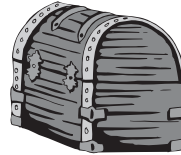
