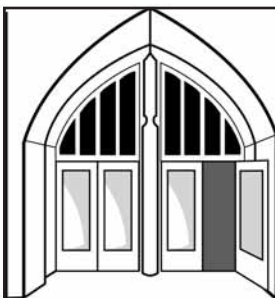

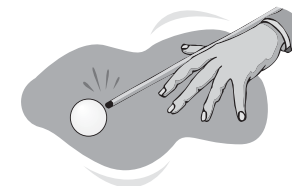

This month's program features **Elizabeth Lion**, speaking on "**Women Transforming Communities.**"

Elizabeth Lion was born in the 20's, grew up in the 30's and was a young adult in the 40's and 50's, decades that were decidedly different from the present. Through anecdotes (she is a story-teller par excellence) and examples of the women, men and events that built the foundation of her socio-political beliefs and convictions, she will offer her thoughts and feelings about the ways women can transform and alter the pace and direction of our communities, country, world and planet.

Elizabeth grew up in New Jersey and was educated as a nurse. She joined the IU faculty in 1969 and received an Ed.D. in 1990 from Indiana University writing a dissertation on the sexuality of the dying. She taught very popular courses on human sexuality. She was a member of the Affirmative Action Committee at IU, was active with the Commission on Multicultural Understanding on campus, and served as a member of the Bloomington Faculty Council. She has volunteered with the crisis line at Middle Way House and also worked with Positive Link as an HIV counselor. She has always been an active and involved member of the community in which she lives.

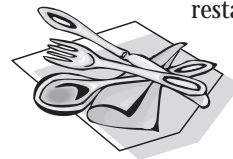

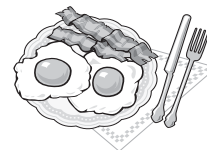

Dr. Bradley J. Hamm
Dean of the School of Journalism, IU Bloomington
"Is Fairness Dead as a Journalistic Concept?"

Dr. Hamm will speak about the current pressures on journalism in a democratic society, including a wide range of issues involving objectivity, journalism ethics, public broadcasting, the new technologies, celebrity journalism and others.

Dr. Bradley J. (Brad) Hamm succeeded Dr. Trevor Brown as Dean of the Indiana University School of Journalism in July. He came to IU from Elon University in North Carolina where he was Associate Dean and Associate Professor in the School of Communications. He received a Ph. D. in Mass Communication Research from the University of North Carolina in 1996, an M.A. in Journalism from North Carolina in 1990 and a B.A. in Communications from Catawba College (N.C.) in 1986. He began his professional career as a reporter and sportswriter for *The Salisbury (N.C.) Post* in 1982 and later worked for the Associated Press in Columbia, South Carolina, and the *New York Times* Regional Newspaper Group in North Carolina. He won a Chairman's Award from *New York Times* Publisher Arthur Sulzberger Jr. for a project called "Left Behind," which analyzed the economic crisis affecting thousands of residents in the North Carolina mountains. He is only the fifth top administrator in the long history of the IU School of Journalism. Trevor Brown retired in July after 17 years as Dean of the IU School.

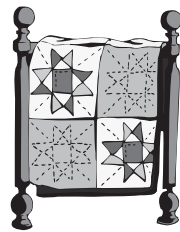

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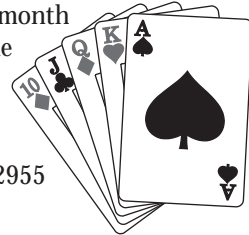

NEW!!!! BUNCO

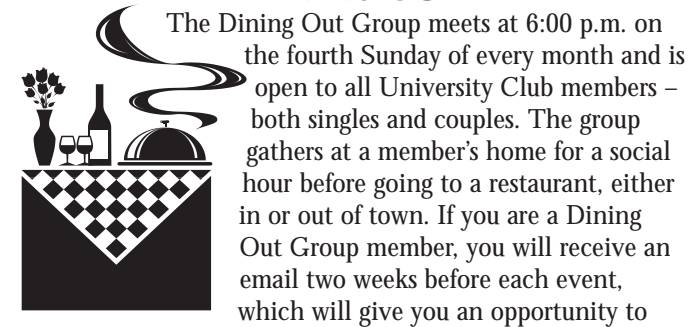

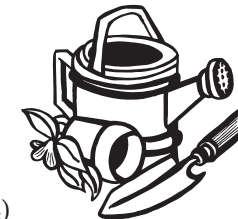
