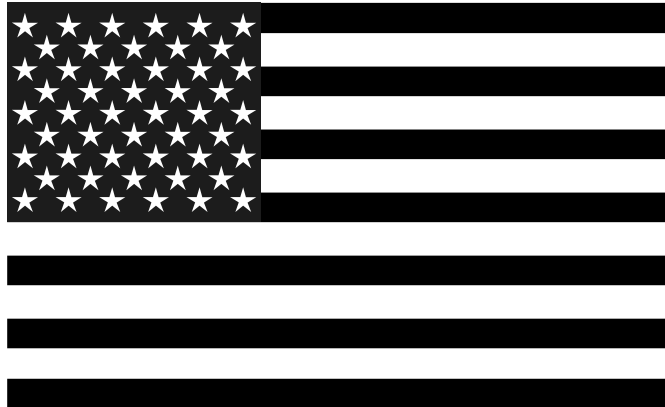

ANTARCTIC ADVENTURE

On Tuesday evening October 23 at 7:30, the University Club brings you E. Brady Hancock, Professor and Chairman of the Department of Peridontics and Allied Dental Programs at the IU School of Dentistry. In addition to his professional pursuits, he is an avid amateur nature photographer who uses his photography to express the wonders of nature. He took the picture featured in this article.

He traveled to Antarctica in December-January, 1998-1999 and plans to return during the same season in 2002-2003. He will present a wonderful program on his tour of Antarctica and the Southern Ocean. Dr. Hancock's presentation will begin with his departure from Ushuaia, Argentina; stop in the Falkland Islands to visit the massive colonies of albatross and penguins; proceed south to South Georgia Island, former headquarters of the whaling industry; and then further south to the Antarctic Peninsula.

On **Thursday, October 11**, the University Women's Club will have a program at the IU Cyclotron. Dr. Susan Klein will speak on "New Uses for Old Accelerators: Using Protons to Treat Cancer."

The Indiana University Cyclotron Facility, which receives funding from Indiana University, the National Science Foundation, and the U. S. Department of Energy, is a national scientific research center in which the process of accelerating, scattering, and detecting subatomic particles is carried out on a large scale. About 200 scientists, technical staff, and students from around the world are involved with experiments there each year. Please join Dr. Klein, a biophysicist with the Cyclotron, as she explores "New Uses for Old Accelerators: Using Protons to Treat Cancer." This fascinating presentation will consist of a short lecture and a short tour. Come ready to be amazed at this hidden gem on the campus of IU Bloomington.

Guests should enter through the main door of the Cyclotron. Signs will be posted leading to the Auditorium.

The use of our Web site has grown dramatically in the last few months, which is wonderful. We are able to reach members quickly with news of upcoming events. We also do this through e-mails to members who have e-mail addresses.

Unfortunately, not all our members have access to the Web site or e-mail and some feel that they are at a big disadvantage. This happened just this month with the University Club's October trip to Chicago.

“The End of the Earth,” “Going to the Ice,” “The Frozen Continent,” “The Last Frontier,” “The Bottom of the Earth” - all these phrases have been used to describe Antarctica. Most of us have the perception of Antarctica as a frozen wasteland, almost devoid of life. For eight to nine months a year, this perception probably is close to the truth, but during the austral summer (mid-November through early March), the coastal areas warm and are filled

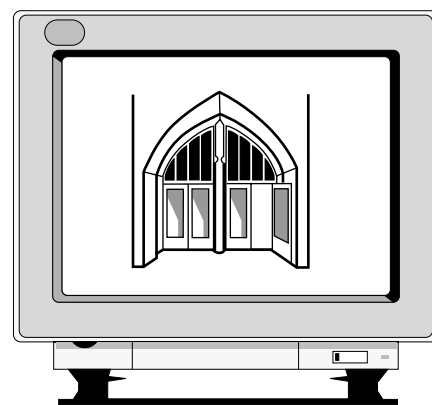


with life. This presentation by Dr. Hancock will look at some of the abundant life that calls this inhospitable area home, and some of the unspoiled scenic beauty found there.
