New rule #1:

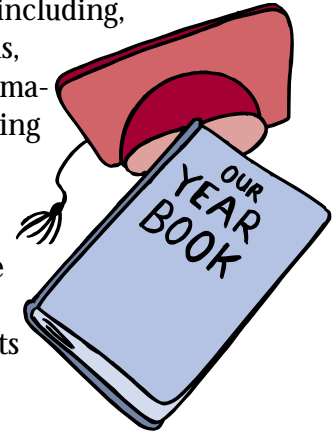
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New rule #2:

Annual Meeting - A Moment of Science

Ever had questions about "a moment of science"? You can get your questions answered on Monday, March 29, at 11:45 a.m. at the University Club's Annual Meeting in the Clubrooms. Our speaker, Don Glass, will speak on "A Moment of Science—And That's All I Can Stand." He is the producer of "A Moment of Science" on WFIU and has been associated with the program since its beginning in 1988 so he should have all the answers.

This series is heard across America and around the world on Armed Forces Radio Network and on the English language service of Deutsche Welle.

In addition to producing "A Moment of Science," he has edited two books related to the series: *Why You Can Never Get to the End of the Rainbow* and *How Can you Tell if a Spider Is Dead?*

Our speaker has worked in public radio since 1966. From 1970 to 1990 he was Program Manager of WFIU and is currently the station's Special Projects Director and Senior Producer. Away from the office he is a volunteer firefighter and an emergency medical technician.

He graduated magna cum laude from Shorter College in Rome, Georgia, and completed his graduate work at Indiana University. Among his professional activities, he has been a member of the Music Advisory Committee of the National Educational Radio Network, and the Media Advisory Panel of the Indiana Arts Commission. He has also produced and hosted many special programs including: the live broadcast of the Indiana University Philharmonic from Avery Fisher Hall in Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts, New York; 1982 broadcasts of the International Violin Competition of Indianapolis; the nationally syndicated series

Music from Indiana; and a series on the voyages of Christopher Columbus. Currently he is the producer of A Moment of Science, with which he has been associated since its beginning in 1988. Between lunch and Glass's presentation, Richard Dever, President of the University Club, will deliver a brief "State of the Club" report and officers for the next term will be elected and amendments to the U Club Bylaw will be voted on.

University Women's Club program



On Thursday, March 11, at 1 p.m., the program will be in the University Club's President's Room when Erner speaks on The Symbols of the Euro. On the first day of 2002, the Euro became the currency of much of continental Europe. Although the participating nations lost their fiscal individuality, they found a way to maintain their national identities: while the sides of the new coins indicating the denominations are the same wherever they circulate, on the reverse they carry varying designs, chosen by the country in which they originated. Some French coins, for example, display the motto *Liberté, Égalité, Fraternité* from the Revolution of 1789, and Spanish ones show a portrait of Cervantes, author of the nation's esteemed *Don Quixote*. Some coins minted in Germany depict the Brandenburg Gate, a site representing good as well as bad memories from this country's past. For all the nations together, no fewer than sixty different symbols were created. In our session we shall view these symbols and discuss their meaning. Of particular interest will be the review of the reasons why the various nations may have chosen the symbols they did, taking into consideration their history and their cultural traditions.
