



The Student Right to Know Act (SRKA) requires institutions of higher education to publish the graduation rates of their full-time beginner students according to a standard methodology established by the Department of Education.

Represented in the table below is the percentage of first-time students that are full-time in the fall in relationship to all first-time students entering in the fall. Graduation rates by intended degree is provided in the second and third table. Finally the last table provides the overall graduation rate of the students who started in the fall as full-time students and received degrees within 150% of program length.

(Bachelor's degree = 6 years, Associate's degree = 3 years, Certificate degree = 1.5 years).
