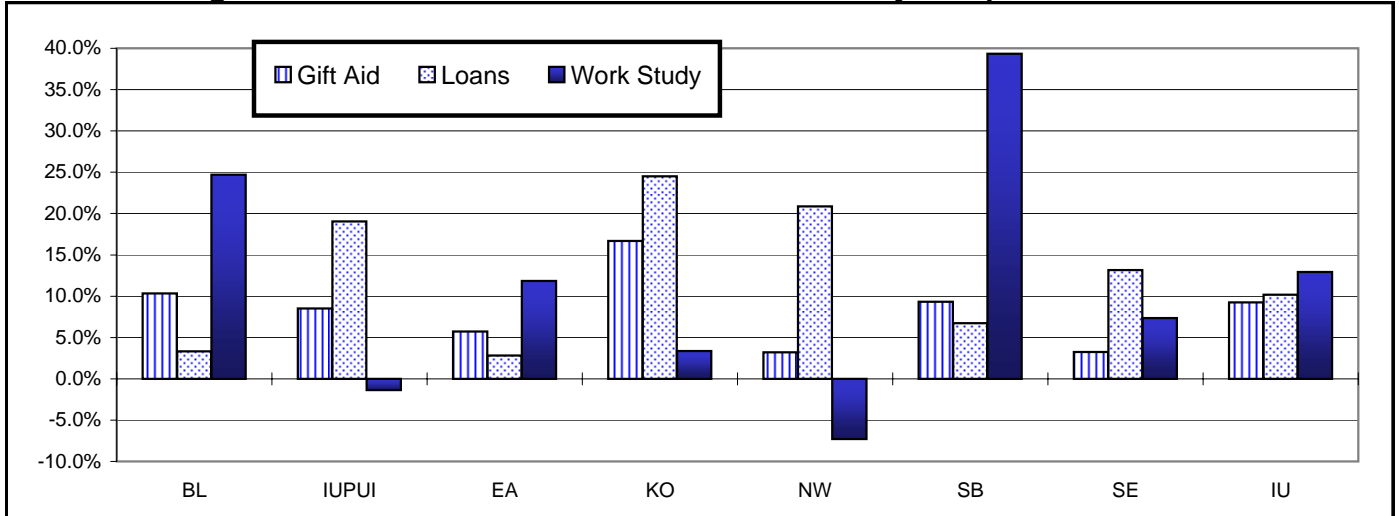

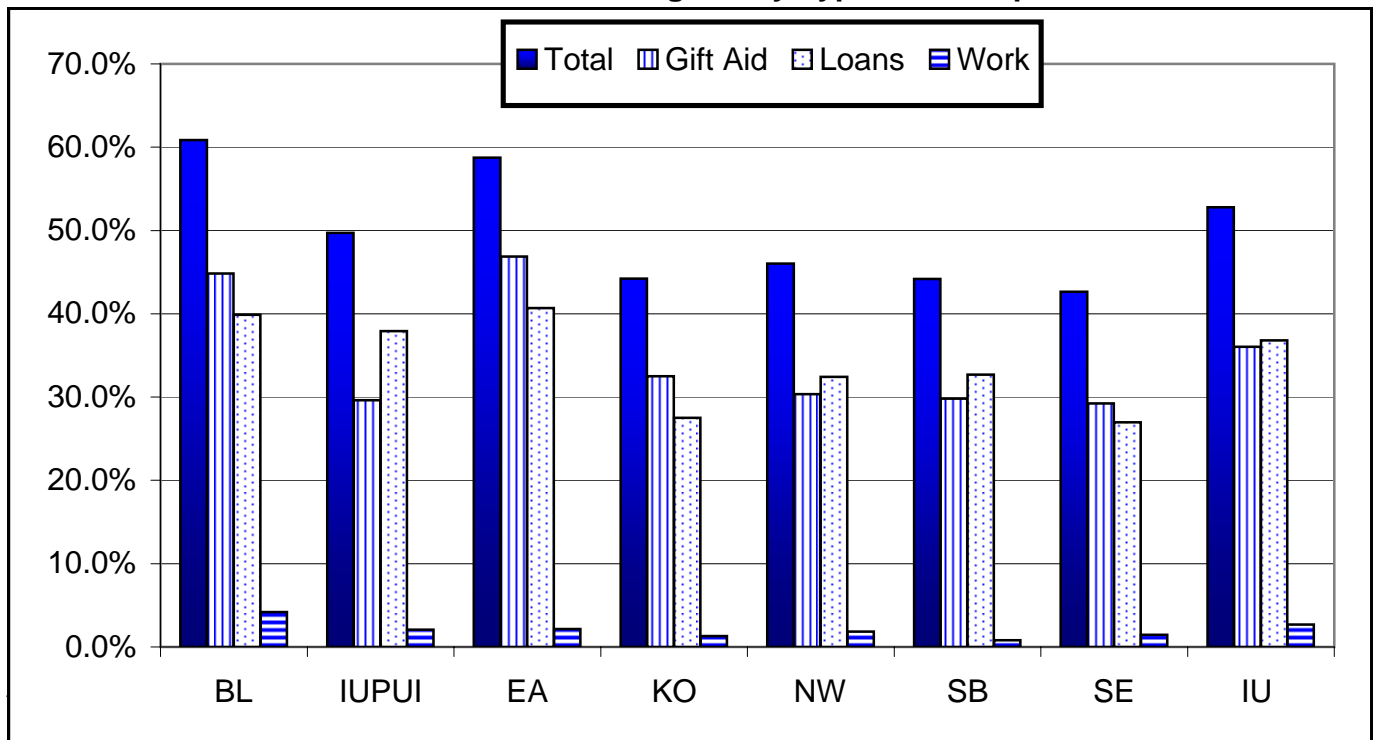

The data for this report comes from the institution's Student Information System (SIS) submission to the Indiana Commission for Higher Education. The Commission requires all public state institutions to submit a dataset that provides an accounting for all enrollment activity over the four semester time period roughly equivalent to the July 1 through June 30 fiscal year (Summer II, Fall, Spring, Summer I). The financial aid categories depicted on this page reflect the Commission's schema for reporting aid.

Wherever possible, aid reported to the Commission comes from bursar records and reflect actual monies disbursed to the students minus any repayments which were necessitated by changes in student eligibility. Fiscal year end reports may present a slightly different view of financial aid figures because of the imperfect alignment of summer semesters to the fiscal calendar.
