Introduction

The community agreement, based on rules and guidelines for appropriate behavior, serves two purposes: to set the tone for an inclusive environment where members involve themselves in community decisions that impact their lives, and to provide stability through the use of guidelines that the majority agrees are fair and acceptable. Please complete this survey in preparation to discuss the standards this community will set for acceptable behavior and environment. *Return this survey to your RA by the deadline, which is set for your floor.*

General

In choosing to attend Indiana University, we realize that we agree to accept the standards established through the Residence Hall A-Z Handbook, RPS Diversity Statement, and Student Code of Conduct. We further understand that like all citizens, we are subject to local, state, and federal law.

Non-Negotiable

1. We realize that living in a floor and center community requires flexibility, tolerance, patience, understanding, and respect. We believe that solving problems between ourselves first must be a high priority.
2. We will treat others as we would like to be treated.
3. We realize each of us has a responsibility to other community members. This means being accountable to each other for the noise level, acts of vandalism, behaviors, and choices which impact others.
4. We understand there are standing policies, such as the alcohol policy, that are not negotiable as a community.
5. We realize that our choices should at all times take into account the rights of others.
6. We will consider others in the manner which we choose to represent ourselves both through our behavior and in the way we decorate our floor, including the outside of room doors.

Academic Environment

Non-Negotiable

1. We agree that being a student must be a high priority. We must respect each other's need for quiet, privacy and study/sleep time.
2. We agree that during quiet hours it is necessary to return to the floor quietly.
3. We agree that during quiet hours, all noise must be contained within a room. In other words, volume within a room cannot be heard outside the room door.

Civility (Respect, Community Pride, Enforcement, Accountability)

Non-Negotiable

- Both residents and resident assistants (RAs) may confront situations that are policy or community agreement violations.
- The person confronting and the person confronted will treat each other with respect, courtesy, and consideration.
- We agree to comply with requests from duty RAs, other RAs and residents from our floor when asked to stop a policy violation or infringement on their rights.
- We will seek out staff assistance ONLY when our efforts to work out a problem have been ineffective.
- If a non-floor member confronts us regarding a policy that conflicts with our community agreement, we will be cooperative and try to work through the situation. If no resolution is reached, we will work with the RA and GS toward a resolution.

Negotiable

- When floor members or guests are being too noisy late at night we will
 - knock on our RAs door and ask for assistance in confronting the situation
 - call the RA on duty asking for the situation to be addressed
 - knock on their door and ask them to be quiet

Security

Non-Negotiable

- Each member of the community is expected to abide by the terms of this agreement.
- Community members are expected to hold individuals accountable to the standards of this agreement.
- We will not prop doors or allow unescorted guests in our community.
- We will not transfer our room keys to friends, guests, or other students.

Negotiable

We recognize the terms of this agreement may need to be revisited, as necessary, and outline the following process the community will take in order to revisit the agreement.

- Floor members who are interested in revisiting the agreement may work with their RA to create a meeting place and time. Floor members will be given _____ days notice of a meeting in which the agreement will be revisited.
- The floor members, with assistance from the RA, will notify the floor members of the meeting by:
 - large sign by main entrance to floor
 - knocking door to door _____ days before the meeting

Common Space (Kitchen, Lounge, Laundry, Floor Maintenance, Recycling, Lounges)

Non-Negotiable

1. We understand that this floor and center is our home. We will respect the other members of the community by not damaging the building.
2. In instances of vandalism, we understand that the community will be held responsible for damages if an individual cannot or will not accept responsibility for these actions.
3. For fire safety concerns, we will not decorate the hallway or ½ of our room doors. In addition the information posted on the doors should not offend any community member, if so we will agree to remove the information.
4. If items are left in the lounge for more than 48 hours we will inform or RA and/or contact the entire community.

Negotiable

1. When the fire alarm sounds we will help evacuate the building by:
 - a) knocking on doors as we leave the floor.
 - b) electing fire marshals whose responsibility will be to knock on the doors of the floor.

2. If vandalism occurs on the floor, we would prefer:
 - a) the RA to document the situation and ask the graduate supervisor to investigate, understanding the whole community could be charged if no individual is found responsible.
 - b) to hold a floor meeting with center staff present to discuss the situation, hoping to determine the responsible party. If no responsible individual could be found, the community would accept responsibility for the damages.
 - c) to hold a floor meeting with center staff NOT present to discuss the situation, hoping to determine the responsible party. If no responsible individual could be found, the community would accept responsibility for the damages.
3. If the vandalism can be taken care of as a community (i.e., cleaning up a mess), we would like to be held responsible in the following manner:
 - a) the floor community will be immediately charged for the damages and/or clean-up.
 - b) the floor community will be given 1 day to repair and/or clean-up the damages; and if not done within this time frame, the floor community will be immediately charged.
4. We would like our floor lounge utilized in the following ways:

5. The kitchen is available for all members of the community, and the community must take responsibility for its care. We agree that our kitchen should:

Community Identity

Non-Negotiable

1. We agree to discuss with roommates any situation that may make them uncomfortable, such as overnight guests or the need for privacy and quiet. We will be honest with each other and remember that each of us is entitled to an opinion.
2. We will always be courteous and civil with floor members and guests.
3. When anyone asks us to lower our noise level, we will do so immediately.
4. Guest of floor members will be escorted in the center at all times.

Negotiable

1. We have determined the following visitation policy for our floor:
